





Week Zero opened the local high school football campaign, and it was a bumpy one for teams in our West Orange County area, winning just four games.

On Thursday, Los Amigos defeated its former Garden Grove League rival Santiago 46-7. On Friday, Marina blanked Westminster 23-0, Huntington Beach bested Orange 56-42 and Garden Grove defeated Bellflower 42-0 in a strong debut for new Argonaut coach Matt LemMon.

Brady Edmunds of Huntington Beach High had an outstanding game, passing for 185 yards and four touchdowns. On the other side of the ball, Starlone Thomas – a freshman – threw for 442 yards and four scores for the Orange Panthers.

Oiler special teams made the difference, as they scored on an interception and two kickoff returns.

Los Amigos' win over Santiago was powered by a potent running attack. Raul Cruz rushed for 89 yards and Issac Galindo ran for 86 yards. They totaled five touchdowns.

The sole Cavalier score came on a 54-yard run by Ozzy Granados.

Garden Grove High's football team— with just three returning starters on offense—had an impressive opening night with Jayden Dean and Quentin Pacelli powering a strong ground game.

The Argonauts will take on former Garden Grove League and district rival Pacifica next Friday at Bolsa Stadium. Grove will be playing in the new Kappa League, opening conference play on Oct. 4 hosting Esperanza.



U.S. National Park:

discoveries

The words "For the Benefit and Enjoyment of the People" stretch across the northern entrance of our nation's first national park, Yellowstone.

According to the Department of Interior, the goal of the National Park Service is, and has always been, to keep our wild places protected and unimpaired for future generations. To that end, more than 400 areas and 84 million acres spanning all 50 states and several unincorporated territories of the United States, protect America's greatest natural treasures. With 61 of those wilderness areas toting National Park designation, it can be tricky trying to pick which park to visit.

So, to help you determine which parks should be higher on your bucket list, we ranked each park based on their overall accessibility, facilities and accommodations, trails and attractions, crowds, and, of course, overall 'wow' factor, which we measured by photo ops and stunning scenery.

Keep in mind, it's almost impossible to say that one is better than the next—there's truly something special about each one of our national parks.



Badlands National Park, SOUTH DAKOTA


We see you South Dakota, and your 244,000 acres of pristine, protected wilderness. Although Badlands isn't entirely unknown, it's often referred to as an under-appreciated park in comparison to heavy hitters like Yosemite or Yellowstone.

Yet, each year, over 1 million visitors travel along the Badlands Loop Road to experience magnificent craggy buttes, pinnacles and spires that seem to surprise the surrounding prairie grasslands. As far as accommodations go, Badlands is home to two year-round, first-come, first-serve campgrounds. Or, if you don't want to rough it, the Cedar Pass Lodge, a seasonal chalet, is also within park limits

Although this Mars-like landscape has several accessible trails and overlooks — like the Pinnacles Overlook, Cliff Shelf Nature Trail, and Fossil Exhibit Trail — you won't find nearly as many designated trails here as you will find in other, comparable national parks. Fortunately, their open backcountry policy permits hikers to explore off-trail. No permit? No problem. You can venture literally anywhere in the park, as long as you're 1.5 miles from a road or trail.

Still, although Badlands has a lot to offer, we have to recognize that mixedgrass prairie and exploring fossil beds isn't necessarily for everyone. In terms of spectacular scenery, Badlands just doesn't deliver the same oomph for effort as some of the other parks.




Elviz Waz a Natural Blond and Used Shoe Polish as Hair Dye

You'd be hard-pressed to find evidence of Elvis' natural blond hairstyle, as only one known photo exists, hanging on the wall of Graceland. From a young age, Elvis dyed his hair jet black with shoe polish — which was cheaper than hair dye — in an effort to make his blue eyes stand out. Elvis also began applying eyeliner to further accentuate his eyes around 1960, a trick he learned from actor Tony Curtis. As Elvis rose to fame, he continued to dye his hair to maintain his image, though he eventually shifted from shoe polish to a patented hair dye combination of Miss Clairol 51D and Black Velvet/Mink Brown by Paramount. Elvis later enlisted the services of Larry Geller, a beloved stylist in West Hollywood who also worked with stars such as Marlon Brando and Steve McQueen.

The Sundarbans — mostly in Bangladesh, though partially in Eastern India — is one of the world's largest tidal mangrove forests, and it's fa-



mous for also being one of the largest Bengal tiger reserves. A UNESCO World Heritage site since 1987 on the Indian side and 1997 on the Bangladesh side, it covers 140,000 hectares and is home to a wide range of wild fauna, including 260 bird species and other threatened species, such as the estuarine crocodile and Indian python.

FIVE POLL NUMBERS THAT TELL THE STORY OF THE **DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION — AND WHAT'S COMING NEXT**

The polls have shifted significantly since Harris joined the presidential race against Trump.

NBC Universal

CHICAGO — A historic switch in the presidential ticket. A shift in the polling. And a stillundefined presidential nominee.

That's the backdrop to this week's Democratic convention, which began Monday with President Joe Biden passing the torch to Vice President Kamala Harris and will end Thursday night with Harris officially accepting her party's presidential nomination.

These five numbers help set the stage for this week's events — and for the rest of the 2024 campaign once the conventions are over.

when Biden was still in the race. In July's Washington Post/ABC poll, Biden and Trump were tied at 46%.

(2) 81%

That's the share of Democratic voters who say they're satisfied with Harris as the party's presidential nominee, versus 15% who say they would have preferred someone else, according to a recent national CNBC poll.

It's a staggering shift in enthusiasm from July's NBC News poll, when just 33% of Democrats said they were satisfied with Biden as the nomia Financial Times poll found the two candidates essentially even on the issue.

So Harris is trailing on an issue that voters typically say is the most important one facing the country in 2024. But it's also less than half the size of Biden's deficit against Trump on the economy when NBC News' poll tested them on the issue six months ago.

This comes as Harris has tried to put more meat on the bone of her economic platform, between her speech on Friday laying out plans to address the cost of food, housing, medicine and child care if elected and the news Monday that she supports

raising the corporate tax rate to 28%.

(4) 64%

That's the percentage of voters who say they know what Harris stands for, per a recent CBS News/YouGov poll.

That's a majority of voters, but it's smaller than the 86% of voters who say they know what Trump stands for.

That illustrates one of the Democrats' top goals for this convention: clearly define their party's presidential nominee to the public, as the Republicans race to define her on their terms.

This advanced process ensures the water meets or exceeds state and federal drinking water standards, providing a reliable and high-

quality source for our community. It's a remarkable project that is a model for California and the world, and it is operating right here in Fountain Valley.

Water produced by the GWRS is sent to the groundwater basin where it is eventually pumped by 19 cities and retail water districts and served as part of the drinking water supply that they provide to 2.5 million people in the region. A portion of



Most Iconic Moments in History



In this touching photograph from Vietnam, 1966, Pfc. Clark Richie smells a perfumed letter sent to him from his girlfriend back home in Jay, Oklahoma. In the jungle setting of Vietnam, surrounded not only by enemy fighters but also by strange animals and natural hazards, an American soldier -- even a country boy from Jay -- could feel like he was on another planet. Letters from home were treasured keepsakes.

The photo was taken by John Nance, an Associated Press reporter who also wrote an article (published in April 1966) about Richie's war experiences. Nance shared the contents of a letter Richie was writing to his mother on the eve of an offensive:

Dear Mom, I got your letter yesterday. Glad you and everyone else are fine. I am too, except for the heat and my blisters. By the time you read this we will have completed our first major operation. If there's anything to worry about you'll know before you get this letter.

Later in the day, Richie went into Cu Chi to teach English to some Vietnamese children. On the ride back to base, he reflected on the deadly irony of his situation:

Weird, to think that tomorrow or next week—or even right now—we could meet up with the big brothers and fathers of some of those kids back there, and we'd try to kill each other. It's a strange business.

How to Make Brandied Cocktail Cherries



ARE BRANDIED CHERRIES THE SAME AS MARASCHINO CHERRIES?

The terms maraschino cherry and brandied cherry are often used interchangeably today. However, maraschino cherries originally referred to cherries preserved specifically in maraschino liqueur made from mascara cherries.

A longside lemon and lime, the cherry is one of bartending's most iconic garnishes—an edible sweet treat to finish your drink. Whether a Manhattan, Aviation, Tom Collins, or Hurricane, the finishing touch of a cherry, often served skewered on a pick, has become the signature flourish of countless cocktail creations. While the 1980s and '90s saw the cocktail cherry transformed into a sickly sweet, artificial sugar bomb, recent decades have seen a revival in high quality brandied and candied offerings.

While you can always buy jars of brandied cherries, they're never quite as good as the ones you make yourself. This recipe for flavorful brandied cherries comes from bartender and owner of the legendary Teardrop Lounge in Portland, Oregon, Daniel Shoemaker, and is well worth the extra work.

When you get started, be sure to clear away anything from your workspace that you wouldn't want to spatter with cherry juice accidentally. Even when you're careful, mishaps happen, so wear clothes—and maybe an apron—you don't mind staining. Because of the relatively high alcohol content and sealed jars, these cherries will last a few years if you keep them in a cool, dry space away from sunlight or in the refrigerator.

Ingredients

5 pounds ripe, firm sweet cherries

1/2 cup allspice berries, whole

1/2 cup juniper berries, whole

6 stick cinnamon sticks, lightly crushed

3 pods star anise

5 cups sugar

1 cup lemon juice, freshly squeezed and strained

3 cups water

2 1/2 cups brandy

1 1/2 cups rum

1 cup bourbon

Steps

Pull off the stems and punch out the pits of the cherries with a cherry pitter.

Add the juniper berries, allspice berries, cinnamon sticks and star anise to the center of a double layer of cheesecloth and tie into a secure bundle.

Combine the sugar, the lemon juice and the 3 cups of water in another large stockpot that holds at least 10 quarts. Bring to a simmer, stirring just until the sugar is dissolved.

Add the spice bundle and continue to simmer for about five minutes.

Add the cherries. Using the slotted spoon, stir the cherries until they are all soaked in the syrup and are thoroughly warmed. You don't want to actually cook the cherries, just allow them to absorb the syrup.

Return the liquid and cherries to a simmer and pour in the brandy, rum and bourbon, stirring to combine. When the liquid is warmed through, remove the pot from the heat. Be sure not to boil the liquid because you don't want to cook off too much alcohol.

Using a wide-mouth funnel or jar filler and a slotted spoon, pack each canning jar with cherries, filling it to the top. Give the jar a good tap on the counter to settle the fruit so there are minimal air gaps. Ladle the hot syrup into the jars up to about half an inch from the rim. Place the flat part of the lid on the jar, and screw the band on lightly.

Run the jars through a hot water bath.* Allow them to cool and let the seals form properly. You'll hear a nice pop as the vacuum forms and the lid is sucked down. Tighten the rings of all the jars that have sealed properly.

*Note: The duration of time needed in the hot water bath depends on your elevation and the size of your jars. Check with your USDA home extension agent for specific information about how to safely can food.

1969 Datsun 240Z

Here's How Electrify America Chargers Are Evolving

California is still the focal point of new station concepts, but the lessons learned could translate to other parts of the country.

- VW Group's charging arm has focused on upgrading existing stations to modern hardware, among other efforts, and has introduced its next-gen charger that can deliver up to 350 kW.
- The new chargers are estimated to require 80% fewer on-site maintenance visits than older units, and feature a smaller footprint, in addition to other improvements.
 - Electrify America is working to introduce Tesla's North American Charging Standard (NACS) to the network in 2025.

There's range anxiety, and then there's arriving at a non-working charger anxiety. And just like the former continues to be an issue no matter how frequently automakers whisper to us in a soothing voice that range anxiety is a figment of our imagination, the latter is not showing any signs of going away, either.

In fact, the hardware installed years ago is not particularly shiny and new anymore, and as we all know older electrical items tend to develop issues after a few years (unless they're a piece of Sony video or stereo equipment from the Reagan administration, in which case they're still working).

What is Volkswagen Group's charging network doing to address what has snowballed into a larger, industry-wide problem?

The first step, as in many programs, is admitting you have a problem.

"Legacy hardware is aging and, in many instances, is now charging the same number of vehicles in one week as it once charged in an entire year," Electrify America noted in its report to CARB this month. "Accordingly, these older chargers require more dispatches for on-site maintenance and ultimately must be replaced."

In fact, Electrify America hasn't opened a single new station in California in the second quarter of 2024.

Rather, it has been working on upgrading existing stations over the past few months, and installing hardware that is estimated to require 80% fewer onsite maintenance visits than older chargers.

The next-gen chargers that EA is rolling out deliver up to 350 kW and feature a new exterior design with a smaller footprint, in addition to a liquid-cooled connector cable with a new cable management system that can stretch to just about any point on an EV, no matter how it's parked. The next-gen chargers also feature a brighter 15-inch screen that is less susceptible to glare from the sun.

Electrify America notes a couple of other trends when it comes to charger usage. More than 20% of electric-vehicle charging sessions in California were activated via Plug&Charge, which does not require card or app-based activation. And only 9.09% of sessions in the state were started using the card reader at all, with California users preferring app activation compared to other methods.

Plug&Charge capability is still the ideal and most futuristic method of initiating charging sessions, even though it is taking Tesla's competitors in the charging sphere some time to catch up.

Work is under way to introduce Tesla's North American Charging Standard

(NACS) to the EA network, with the NACS J3400 connector slated to become an option for visiting EVs in 2025.

And other strategies—some of them painfully overdue—are being implemented as well.

"These strategies include increasing the number of chargers at existing stations to accommodate increasing vehicle volumes, deploying the NACS J3400 connector once it is standardized, and continuing to add new and larger stations to the network," the company says.

Earlier this year Electrify America opened the first indoor charging hub of its type in the US in San Francisco, with 20 hyper-fast 350-kW chargers inside. The charging hub is staffed, assuring greater charger reliability and amenities, though for now it is the sole EA station of its type.

And EA is in the process of adding new stations in California, where it currently has some 250 locations, with 32 currently under development.

Despite the popular image of California as some kind of EV utopia, adding new stations in California is far from easy.

"It costs 26% more, on average, to design and construct an Electrify America sta-

tion in California than it costs to build a station with the same number of chargers in another state," the company noted in its report to CARB.

"This higher cost per station results in California receiving fewer stations per dollar invested by Electrify America, and these higher costs are primarily driven by permitting delays and utility site energization delays."

One way around the issues associated with permitting and grid energization has been the addition of off-grid chargers to the network, built by Beam Global. To date, EA operates 60 solar-powered Level 2 chargers at 30 locations in the state, primarily in the Central Valley—

that aren't really hooked up to anything.

The chargers feature 4.28-kW sun-tracking solar arrays and a small battery energy storage system (BESS) that holds 32 kWh of juice.

Independence from the grid has its benefits when it comes to station reliability, though by their nature these are slower Level 2 chargers, and there's a good reason most of them are in California's Central Valley. So these probably won't be too effective in the snow belt in the longer term.

There is one major lesson in Electrify America's experience in building stations over the past few years: Station owners and operators cannot assume that once built, an EV charger will remain up-to-date and operational until The Great Asteroid of 2064.





However, the world of business isn't always as straightforward as it looks. Regardless of how well-rooted a company's American history is, it doesn't mean that it will always belong to Uncle Sam.

In fact, many quintessentially American brands are

no longer American-owned at all. From Ben and Jerry's to IBM and Holiday Inn, overseas investors have played a big part in keeping these companies moving forward. Without them stepping in, some of them may have ceased to exist altogether.

Ford Headquarters in: Detroit,

Purchased By: N/A Country: International

Ford is American-founded, but it has grown to become a multinational company. The vehicle, like Chevy, touts its American-made status, and it keeps its Detroit factories running all year-round. However, Ford makes some of its parts in China, and it has manufacturing locations in nearly every country.

Ford makes many of its parts in China and then imports them to America, where Ford cars and trucks are assembled in Detroit. Ford gets the vast majority of its car/truck parts from one-hundred suppliers. It gets its transmissions in Germany. Some Fords are up to 90% American-made, in terms of parts. Others are far lower.

as well, in addition to assembly plants in Nashik, India, and Hungary.



FAMOUS MURDERS THAT REMAIN UNSOLVED

espite what television would have you believe, not every murder is solved in under an hour. No matter how much effort police put into the cases at the time and amateur sleuths do afterward, some murders will never be solved.

That's not to say that all unsolved murders are created equal. For some, almost everything about the case is unknown: the culprit, the victim's identity, the method, the motive. On occasion, the best the police can tell the public is that someone was definitely killed, but anything after that is nebulous. With other cases, everyone knows who did it, but they managed to get acquitted or gave the police an alibi. In still others, the only reason that witnesses aren't pointing fingers at the culprit is that these fingers will be immediately cut off — along with their heads.

However, for what little good it did for the victims, sometimes being unable to solve a murder drives those left behind to improve the world so that no one else has to suffer the same fate.

Emma Goldman



To quite a few people, Emma Goldman was a real problem. She was highly opinionated and didn't like the stratified, unequal world she saw around her. As per PBS, she was almost certainly influenced by the turmoil of her childhood spent in post-Revolutionary Prussia and Russia. After she moved to the United States in 1885, she found herself horrified by the violent pushback against labor organizers working to improve their station, as well as the seemingly endless drudgery of her life as a garment worker. So, Goldman became an anarchist.

Just about any government official is going to be wary of anarchists, given how the former are often calling for the dismantling of government and oftentimes in a vehement, attention-getting fashion. It didn't help that Goldman was charismatic, well-spoken, and willing to engage in violence. She was party to the attempted killing of businessman Henry Clay Frick and reportedly inspired President McKinley's assassin, Leon Czolgosz (via PBS). Though Goldman claimed that she didn't want to be violent, she often seemed to come out in favor of it anyway.

Her outspoken nature and anarchist ideals meant that Goldman was frequently deemed to be dangerous. According to the Jewish Women's Archive, she was often arrested and sometimes banned from lecturing, lending further fuel to her fight for freedom of speech. Goldman also advocated for other then-shocking notions, including women's suffrage, unionizing, and sexual freedom.



My dad isn't originally from Texas, but take a bite of his chili, and you would never know.

How can I say this so confidently? Because he has the experts fooled. With several Texas chili cook-off wins under his belt, my dad has proven that his recipe beats that of those raised in the Lone Star State.

But big rewards don't come without hard work: It took years of experimentation for him to perfect his recipe. Whether you are making one to eat while watching football, or entering a chili cookoff yourself, these tips have you covered for the best bowl of Texas chili.

The Secrets Behind My Dad's Award-Winning **Texas Chili**

If you are worried about me sharing my dad's secrets, don't be. When I asked him if I could share the recipe, his response text included not one, but three, exclamation points. If your dad is anything like mine, you know it's a big deal to receive a text that doesn't end with a period or consists of only a thumbs-up emoji. I'll take it that he's excited to add this article to the lengthy list of reasons he can be considered a Texas chili expert.

While he has switched the base recipe up for his chili over the years, my dad's go-to chili recipe is Lady Bird Johnson's Pedernales River Chili. Allrecipes' Texas chili is pretty similar.

Regular Texas chili is good, but you don't win chili cook-offs without going above and beyond. So, here are the secrets that take my dad's chili from yummy to exceptional.

Swap Ground Beef for Brisket

His biggest tip is to replace the ground beef with **6** brisket. While ground beef is fine, brisket is excep-6 tional. Typically, the brisket he uses is leftover from grilling it for dinner the night before. As griln ling is his other area of expertise, making chili is a great way to use precious meat—and have delicious dinners several nights in a row.

There are a few different ways to get your hands on some brisket. My dad would insist on making it yourself—this is Texas, after all—but you have a couple of alternatives, such as buying it precooked or, more preferably, befriending a Texan who makes good brisket.

Letting the chili cook for this long takes basically no work, but my dad recommends that you keep this secret to yourself. Instead, tell everyone you this secret to yourself. Instead, tell everyone you are busy cooking for eight hours when, in reality, you are watching football and casually stirring your g chili. Do Not Add Beans—Ever

A chili can't be considered Texas chili with the addition of beans. My dad insists on this—absolutely no beans go into his chili. This might be controversial for chili fans outside of Texas. But, the reasoning behind it is that adding them distracts from the star of the meal: the meat. Make your chili to your preferences, but know that it wouldn't be wise to serve chili with beans to a Texan and call it chili—especially if that Texan is my dad.

Top With Fritos and Enjoy

My dad always tops his chili with Fritos. I like to use them as a base for my chili like a Fritos pie, which means the scoop-shaped Fritos are the optimal choice here. Add a little sour cream and cheese and you are ready to enjoy your Texas chili.

Bloomingdale's Year Established: 1861 **Store Closures: 1**

Like many other stores, Bloomingdale's temporarily stopped operations at all of its locations in the spring of 2020. As the year progressed, the luxury American Department store began a gradual re-opening plan. The economic downfall that resulted from the months of closure was not kind to Bloomingdale's.

\As of 2022, although Rachel Green's favorite clothing store is yet to return to its former glory, the Macy's subsidiary has re-opened many of its locations. Only one Bloomingdale's has permanently closed thus far — the location that was formerly located at Santa Monica Place in Santa Monica, California.

Year Established: 1956 **Store Closures: 300+**

Founded in Brooklyn, New York, in 1956, Sbarro has been specializing in 'New York Style' pizza for over half a century. At the height of its popularity in the early 2000s, the pizza chain served customers at more than 600 locations, but that number began to dwindle rapidly over the following decade.

With fewer people dining at mall food courts, by 2016, Sbarro had just 318 retail locations remaining. The economic crisis of 2020 forced the closure of dozens more of the pizzerias. Interesting fact: The busiest Sbarro location

was located in the World Trade Center mall before it was destroyed in the attacks of 9/11.

Century 21 Year Established: 1961 **Store Closures: 13**

Century 21 (the department store chain, not the real estate agency) has been part of the American retail world since 1961. Never one of the giants of its industry, Century 21's 13 retail locations had a loyal customer base scattered across the Northeastern States that were disappointed to hear of the discount shop's bankruptcy in December 2020.

After more than a year of hoping, Century 21's longtime customers have finally received some good news. The company's founders, the Gindi Family (along with a private investor), re-purchased Century 21's intellectual property for just \$9 million in 2021. The location in lower Manhattan is scheduled to resume business as usual sometime in 2023.

Store Closures: 137

Founded in 1892, Abercrombie & Fitch has provided Americans with casual wear for over a century. Over the past few decades, mall-based locations have begun popping up everywhere, and by 2020 there were more than 800 Abercrombie stores globally. Since 2020, expansion has slowed to a crawl.

At times, it actually went in reverse. If you're like the 90s American pop band LFO, and you like people "that wear Abercrombie & Fitch," you won't be too pleased to find out 137 retail locations ceased operations in 2020. Amazingly, those 137 stores accounted for more than 1.1 million square feet of prime real estate in some of North America's largest cities.

MLB umpire Nick Mahrley left Sunday's game between the Colorado Rockies and New York Yankees after being hit in the head with a broken bat.

Mahrley was conscious and able to move his arms as he was placed on a stretcher with his head and neck in a brace. The nature of his injury and condition wasn't immediately clear.

The incident happened in the bottom of the fifth inning with the Yankees leading, 4-3. Yankees designated hitter Giancarlo Stanton hit a broken-bat single into left field off Rockies starter Austin Gomber.

The barrel of Stanton's bat snapped off at the handle and rotated around to hit Mahrley in the neck and the side of his head, knocking his facemask off.

Mahrley fell to his knees in pain, but maintained consciousness. He was eventually placed on a stretcher. He was able to raise his arms while he was being placed on the stretcher before he was taken off the field for medical evaluation.

Stanton's hit loaded the bases with one out. The game went into a delay as crew chief Marvin Hudson changed into protective gear to

RFK JR.'S SISTER BLASTS HIM FOR 'INEXPLICABLE EFFORT' TO 'SET FIRE TO MY FATHER'S MEMORY'

Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s sister blasted him for his endorsement of former President Trump, saying that it is an "inexplicable effort" to tarnish their father's memory. Kerry Kennedy, the sister of the former presidential candidate, ripped her brother

for embracing Trump on MSNBC's "Inside with Jen Psaki." Her brother threw his support behind Trump on Friday after suspend-

ing his own campaign.

"So I'm outraged and disgusted by my brother's gaudy and obscene embrace of Donald Trump. And I completely get out and separate and dissociate myself from Robert Kennedy Jr. in this flagrant and inexplicable effort to desecrate and trample and set fire to my father's memory," Kerry Kennedy said Sunday.



Members of Robert F. Kennedy Jr.'s family, including Kerry Kennedy, spoke out Friday against his endorsement of the former president in a statement, saying that it was "a betrayal of the values that our father and our family hold most dear."

Kerry Kennedy reiterated Sunday her support for Vice President Harris and Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz (D). She said her father "would have detested almost everything Donald Trump represents" if he was alive today.

"I think ... the stakes this November couldn't be higher, which is exactly why my whole family will be fighting so hard to reelect Kamala Harris and Coach Walz, who've been champions for the values that my family has fought for, for years," she said.

"Donald Trump is the polar opposite. He's a threat to most basic freedoms that are core to who we are as Americans, the right for women to control our bodies, the right to live in communities safe from gun violence, to love who you love," she added

His family has regularly dismissed RFK Jr.'s independent candidacy since he first launched his presidential bid last year. Kerry Kennedy also emphasized the importance of November's election and ensuring that Trump is defeated.

"I think that Donald Trump is incredibly dangerous to us. And I think what Bobby has done here is anathema to everything. Not only [what] our family stands for, but what Bobby has given his life to. You know, he spent so many years out there working on protecting the environment. And that's the opposite of what Trump plans to do," she said.

Ingredients

Cookies:

- 1 ½ cups white sugar
- ½ cup butter, softened
- ½ cup shortening
- 2 large eggs
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 ¾ cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons cream of tartar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

Cinnamon-Sugar Coating:

2 tablespoons white sugar

2 teaspoons ground cinnamon

Directions

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F (200 degrees C).

Make cookies: Beat sugar, butter, shortening, eggs, and vanilla in a large bowl until smooth and creamy.

Whisk flour, cream of tartar, bak-

ing soda, and salt together in a separate bowl. Gradually mix dry ingredients mixture into the wet ingredients just combined. Shape until dough into walnut-sized balls.

Make cinnamon-sugar: Combine sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl or ziptop plastic bag.

Place dough balls in cinnamon-sugar and roll or shake until coated. Place 2 inches apart on ungreased baking sheets.

Bake in the preheated oven until set but not too hard, 8 to 10 minutes, switching racks halfway through.

Remove from the oven and immediately transfer to wire racks to cool.

ELIZABETH CADY STANTON

Elizabeth Cady Stanton (1815-1902) - early feminist, civil rights activist and women's rights advocate.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton was an influential figure in the civil rights movement of the Nineteenth Century. Stanton advocated the end of slavery and equal rights for women and black Americans. She wrote influential pamphlets and books, including: Declaration of Sentiments and Resolutions (1848) A Petition for Universal Suffrage (1866) History of Woman Suffrage (1881-1922) The Woman's Bible (1895-1898) She is considered by many to be one of the key founders of the women's rights movement in the US.



What's the most effective way to remove pesticide residues from fruits and vegetables that I buy at the supermarket?

Dear Earth Talk:

For many decades now, pesticides have been a vital tool for farmers to ensure that their harvests aren't overgrown by weeds or eaten by pests. As a istration (FDA) has placed limits on the amount of pesticide residue found on produce—called "tolerances"—to ensure that people will most likely not be impacted by harmful "persistent organic pollutants" (POPs) such as glyphosate and atrazine. However, it's still important to make individual efforts to clean produce to further protect your personal health and safety.

A recent report from the American Chemical Society analyzed data provided by the U.S. Depart-

> ment of Agriculture (USDA) and found that 20 percent of 59 different produce categories posed significant health risks to consumers despite current pesticide limits. The researchers developed new methods for finding and removing traces of pesticides from produce, as they found that traditional methods of cleaning produce were insufficient. Most notably, the report posits that pesticides go beyond the produce's surface to leach into the food, meaning that washing

may not be as effective. Further research is needed to determine the full risks and implications of current pesticide limits. Regardless, all produce should be cleaned thoroughly before consumption.

There are varied opinions on the best methods for removing pesticide residues from produce, and no method is 100 percent effective. Rinsing produce is somewhat helpful for cleaning off dirt and germs, but soaking their fruits and vegetables in warm vinegar or salt solutions may be better; however, some sources claim that exposure to these solutions may allow chemicals to form more complex, equally dangerous chemical compounds, so always follow soaking with thorough rinsing. Finally, peeling or boiling produce can be highly effective in removing residues, though you will suffer a loss of nutrients.

Of course, the only way to significantly reduce your exposure to food-borne synthetic chemicals is by buying organic, as organic foods are not grown with the assistance of hazardous pesticides. You might have to pay a little more, but isn't your health and peace of mind worth it?




Then an actor plays a role, he or she does everything in their power to really get into it, to feel as that person would feel, and to portray those feelings on the film.

Armand Duplantis breaks his own world record in pole vault — three weeks after setting it at the Olympics



Three weeks after earning a gold medal and setting a world record at the 2024 Paris Olympics, Armand Duplantis keeps making history. On Sunday, the 24-year-old Swedish pole vaulter set yet another world record at the Diamond League Silesia, a track and field event held in Chorzow, Poland.

Duplantis cleared a height of 6.26 meters to win gold and break his own world record for the third time this season. Sunday's first-place finish marks his fourth straight Diamond League gold.

Duplantis, who was born and raised in Louisiana, competes for Sweden internationally; his father is an American pole vaulter, while his mother is a Swedish heptathlete.

The young pole vaulter made a splash at the Olympics, picking up an iconic Paris Olympics celebration on his way to earning a gold medal — his second consecutive gold, after winning the Olympic title in Tokyo. But after securing a first-place finish and breaking an Olympic record in Paris, he didn't stop there: Duplantis kept going for the record, clearing 6.25 meters and breaking his own record by a centimeter.

On Sunday, he did it again, clearing his old record by a centimeter. Duplantis, who went pro in 2019 after one year at LSU, has now broken the world record 10 times in the past four years of competition. His first time was in February 2020, when he set a record of 6.17 at the Copernicus Cup in Torún, Poland.


Rather, it was a bunt.

The problem, though, was his first baseman, in an apparent moment of miscommunication, abandoned his post, meaning the pitcher threw the ball to an unoccupied bag, allowing Norton to score the game-winning run in a 2-1 victory for Lake Mary.



TRUMP TEAM PREPARES FOR **SPRINT TO NOVEMBER WITH** 'ALL HANDS ON DECK' APPROACH

resh off a week of daily counterprogramming events and an effort to steal the spotlight from his new opponent, Donald Trump and his campaign are seeking to harness that pace in the lead-up to November — with plans to aggressively ramp up the former president's schedule, hone his debate skills and cultivate a new ground-game strategy tied to the early voting states, sources familiar with the strategy shift told CNN.

The new approach is itself an acknowledgment that Trump's campaign has struggled to adapt to the fast-changing political landscape after President Joe Biden ended his campaign less than four months before Election

Trump's schedule going forward will look a lot more like the past week — when the Republican nominee visited a different battleground each day — than the 20 months that preceded it. Through November, Trump is expected to hold "several events each week, if not daily," one adviser said, while another predicted the former president will regularly visit two states in a day.

"Think Trump on steroids," one said. "It'll be all hands on deck."

The stepped-up schedule comes as Trump is also preparing for his September 10 debate with Vice President Kamala Harris.

The former president is quietly meeting with Republican lawmakers, policy experts and outside allies in advance of the high-stakes showdown. The "policy discussions" — the Trump campaign's version of debate prep largely mirror the sessions the former president held in the weeks leading up to his June 27 debate with Biden, sources familiar with the meetings told CNN.

"It won't be any different this time around. It worked well for him last time. If it ain't broke, don't fix it," a Trump adviser said.

Moving forward, Trump will focus on battlegrounds where mail-in ballots will soon go out and early voting locations will first open, including in North Carolina and Pennsylvania, as well as states tilting toward one party or the other, such as Minnesota and Florida. The Trump campaign also plans to bolster its teams on the ground in those states, as well as to deploy surrogates to hold get-out-the-vote events.

As he did over the last week, Trump is expected to hold smaller events - in addition to his larger rallies — centered on tailored messages in the hope that some guardrails could help the campaign better focus their candidate. Unlike Trump's sprawling, daylong rallies, these stops will take place in more intimate venues with fewer people and — many of his allies hope — a sharper focus.

The limitations of those efforts, though, grew increasingly apparent throughout last week. Those who know the former president best have long acknowledged that Trump's innate predilection to veer off script and air his grievances can't be changed.

"He's 78 years old and has never been someone easily controlled," one Trump ally told CNN.

During a stop in North Carolina billed as a speech on national security, Trump polled the crowd on whether they wanted him to continue to lob insults at his opponents or stick to policy. When it became clear they preferred the former, Trump mocked his own team.

"My advisers are fired," he joked, then added: "Nah, we'd rather keep it on policy, but sometimes it's hard when you're attacked from all ends.'

During a Michigan speech on public safety, Trump veered into more attacks on Harris, failing to touch on the policies that his team had shared with reporters in advance of his remarks, including a proposal to execute

> child rapists and traffickers. When asked why Trump didn't announce the new policies previewed by his campaign, a campaign official said the former president was "saving those" until after the Democratic National Convention.

> Still, the week of events marked one of the most active periods on the campaign trail of Trump's third White House bid. Since effectively wrapping up the GOP nomination in March, Trump has maintained a notably light campaign calendar, holding one or two rallies a week and spending long stretches out of the public view.

It's a schedule that didn't appear problematic for Trump when his opponent was an unpopular 81-year-old incumbent who struggled to attract audiences. But with Harris and her running mate, Minnesota Gov. Tim Walz, fanning out across battlegrounds and pulling in massive crowds, a change became necessary.

Trump, who has an aversion to traditional debate prep and has argued he doesn't need formal preparation, such as engaging in mock debates, prefers to study his opponent and fine-tune his messaging in a more casual setting, the adviser added.

Former Hawaii Rep. Tulsi Gabbard, for example, has been working with Trump behind the scenes to help him understand Harris' debate style.

Gabbard was among the 2020 Democratic presidential contenders who challenged Harris on the debate stage. Trump's advisers believe Gabbard's attacks on then-Sen. Harris — particularly the scrutiny of her record as a prosecutor — helped undermine Harris' candidacy.

Meanwhile, Trump pollsters Tony Fabrizio and Travis Tunis released a memo Saturday predicting a post-convention bump in polls for Harris, with Fabrizio blaming it largely on favorable media coverage of the vice president.

"The other thing to keep in mind is that while the media is going to focus on the national polls, we need to keep our eye on the ball — that is the polling in our target states," the memo said. "Our goal is to get to 270 and winning these states is how we do it."

Even his choice of where to hold events — visiting deeply red Montana and solidly blue New Jersey while leaving monthlong gaps between stops in key states — sometimes left Republicans scratching their heads.

Trump's campaign now views the period after the Democratic National Convention as an all-out sprint to November, several senior advisers told CNN. The former president's team recently beefed up its political operation by adding new advisers, including Trump's first 2016 campaign manager,

Ohio Sen. JD Vance is also expected to take on a more vigorous schedule the weeks ahead, a source familiar with his relationship. in the weeks ahead, a source familiar with his plans told CNN.

Trump's running mate will hit all the major battlegrounds, with a particu- 🕏 lar focus on the three states that make up the so-called blue wall that Trump of won in 2016 but lost to Biden in 2020: Michigan, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania — the latter of which Vance is expected to visit more frequently than any other state, the source said. The thinking behind that specific focus is that Vance's background growing up in southwestern Ohio strengthens of his appeal with Rust Belt voters. He is expected to continue efforts to connect the opioid epidemic to immigration.

The plans for Vance are in part a direct reaction to his performance on the trail, which people close to the former president say has delighted Trump despite Vance's shaky start, which was plagued by criticism over 2 resurfaced clips of him deriding "childless cat ladies" and suggesting that parents should have more voting power.

In recent conversations, Trump has referred to his running mate as a "political athlete," two people with direct knowledge of the remark told CNN, and has expressed a desire for Vance to get out in front of voters and media viewers as frequently as possible.
