The price of eggs has skyrocketed here's why they're not coming down anytime soon

OMAHA, Neb. — Bird flu is forcing farmers to slaughter millions of chickens a month, pushing U.S. egg prices to more than double their cost in the summer of 2023. And it appears there may be no relief in sight, given the surge in demand as Easter approaches.

The average price per dozen nationwide hit \$4.15 in December. That's not quite as high as the \$4.82 record set two years ago, but the Agriculture Department predicts prices are going to soar another 20% this year.

Shoppers in some parts of the country are already paying more than double the average price, or worse, finding empty shelves in their local grocery stores. Organic and cage-free varieties are even more expensive.

Some grocery stores have even limited how many eggs shoppers can buy.

"It's just robbery," said Minneapolis resident Sage d Mills, who bought eggs to bake a birthday cake last week. "Eggs used to be kind of a staple food for us, it but now you know, you might as well just go out to eat."

The problem tends to linger because it takes months to dispose of all the carcasses, disinfect barns and bring in new birds.

More than 145 million chickens, turkeys and other birds have been slaughtered since the current outbreak began, with the vast majority of them being egg-laying chickens.

Cage-free egg laws in 10 states may also be responsible for some supply disruptions and price increases. The laws set minimum space for chickens or cage-free requirements for egg-laying hens. They've already gone into effect in California, Massachusetts, Nevada, Washington, Oregon, Colorado and Michigan. At a Target in Chicago on Monday, a dozen large conventional eggs cost \$4.49 but a dozen large cage-free eggs were selling for \$6.19.

Why is the virus so hard to control?

Bird flu is primarily spread by wild birds such as ducks and geese as they migrate. While it is fatal to a variety of animals, those species can generally carry it without getting sick, which offers the virus a chance

What is driving up prices?

The bird flu outbreak that started in 2022 is the main reason egg prices are up so much.

Anytime the virus is found on a poultry farm, the entire flock is slaughtered to help limit the virus' spread. And with massive egg farms routinely housing more than 1 million chickens, just a few infections can cause a supply crunch.

to mutate and thrive.

The virus can be spread through droppings or any interaction between farm-raised poultry and wild birds. It's also easily tracked into a farm on someone's boots or by vehicle.

Unlike previous outbreaks, the one that began in 2022 didn't die out in high summer temperatures.

The virus found another new host when dairy cattle started getting sick last March. That creates more opportunities for the virus to linger and spread and unlike poultry, cattle aren't slaughtered when they get sick

because they rarely die from bird flu. More than five dozen people hav The Price of Eggs.

More than five dozen people have also become ill with bird flu and one person died since last March. Nearly all of them worked around sick animals. Health officials haven't yet found evidence of the disease spreading from person to person.

What is being done to stop the virus?

Farmers go to great lengths to protect their flocks

Many poultry farms installed truck washes to disinfect vehicles entering their property and require workers to shower and change clothes before stepping inside a barn. They have also invested in duplicate sets of tools so nothing used in one barn is shared.

Some poultry farmers have even invested in lasers that shoot beams of green light in random patterns to discourage ducks and geese from landing.

Dairy farmers isolate any sick cattle and do additional testing before moving animals off the farm — especially if there has been a nearby outbreak or if the cows are being sent to a meat processing plant. The government is also testing milk. Future vaccines might help, but it's not practical to vaccinate millions of chickens through shots,

and other countries might refuse to purchase meat from vaccinated birds.

Health officials emphasize that any sick birds or cattle are kept out of the food supply. Cooking meat to 165 degrees (74 Celsius) kills bird flu, E. coli, salmonella or anything else. Pasteurization also kills the virus in milk. Raw milk is the only food product linked to illnesses so far.

How much has the outbreak cost so far?

It is impossible to know how much farmers have spent to seal barns, build shower houses for workers or to adopt other biosecurity measures.

"Over the last five years, my small farm alone has spent hundreds of thousands of dollars on biosecurity," said Minnesota turkey farmer Loren Brey. "But not only that, it's the time daily that you're attending to biosecurity."


The U.S. Department of Agriculture has spent at least \$1.14 billion compensating farmers for the birds they have had to kill. A similar number wasn't immediately available for how much has been spent to aid dairies.

USDA spokeswoman Shilo Weir said the department also spent more than \$576 million on its own response.


The prices of turkey, milk and chicken have also seen some pressure from bird flu.

Mike Vickers, a manager at Sentyrz Liquor & Supermarket in Minneapolis, said he can't even stock any organic, cage-free or brown eggs right now and is limited instead to selling large or jumbo eggs. He understands the pain customers are feeling.

"It's the first time in my life that I've ever had to be kind of embarrassed on what I'm selling eggs for," he said. "And it's not our fault. We're paying today \$7.45 for a dozen eggs. We're selling for \$7.59. We're making \$0.14. That's doesn't pay the bills."

Cannabis cafes and expanded outdoor drinking? An end to a banking fee? More protections for your credit score if you face medical debt? These are among the roughly 1,000 new laws hitting California starting the first day of 2025.

If that sounds like a lot, it could have been much more: California lawmakers introduced nearly 5,000 bills in the


most recent legislative session ending this fall, a twoyear period that saw nearly half die without a single vote. In all, lawmakers passed 1,200 about bills in 2024 and Gov. Gavin Newsom vetoed 200 of And those. that's the bureaucratic funnel in а nutshell.

Most of these incoming laws are technical, fix previous laws or are narrow in scope. But there are some that affect lots of Californians, or are just plain interesting.

There are the consumer finance protection laws, numerous education-related laws including one to expand alcohol education that was written by a former lawmaker arrested for a DUI — as well as a law banning local voter ID rules and another granting a few more days to fight an eviction. Paris Hilton makes a cameo, too.



On Sunday July 17, 1955 in Anaheim, California, Disneyland opened its gates at 2:30 PM, with an array of sights for families across the country to behold. With five themed lands and 18 attractions, the park was, and still is, a must experience place. At the opening ceremony Walt Disney christened his 160-acre park with these words:

To all who come to this happy place: welcome. Disneyland is your land. Here age relives fond memories of the past...and here youth may savor the challenge and promise of the future. Disneyland is dedicated to the ideals, the dreams and the hard





What's in a name? Ask Lady Gaga. In a new cover story for ELLE published on Tuesday, Jan. 28, the "Disease" singer, 38, spoke about her upcoming album Mayhem along with her famous moniker.

When asked if Gaga — whose real name is Stefani Joanne Angelina Germanotta - would ever change her stage name, she expressed her admiration for it.

"No! I love being Lady Gaga. I love being me," she said. "I became a star when I was 20. Everything gets reflected back to you that this persona is what makes you special."

She reportedly took on the iconic name when her ex-boyfriend and music producer Rob Fusari called her Gaga because her voice and style reminded him of Queen's song "Radio Ga Ga."

Elsewhere in the cover story with ELLE, Gaga spoke about working on her seventh studio album, which comes out in March.

"The chaos I thought was long gone is fully intact and ready to greet me whenever I'd like," she said of the process.

TRUMP SAYS NJ DRONES WERE 'AUTHORIZED' AFTER SUGGESTING BIDEN KEPT PUBLIC 'IN SUSPENSE'

White House press secretary Karoline Leavitt said the mystery drones flown across New Jersey in late 2024 were "authorized to be flown by the FAA" in the first press be better off saying what it is. Our military knows and our president knows. And for some reason, they want to keep people in suspense."

Ahead of his inauguration, Trump vowed to give a report on drones



briefing of President Donald Trump's second administration.

"I do have news directly from the president of the United States that was just shared with me in the Oval Office, from President Trump directly, an update on the New Jersey drones," Leavitt said.

"After research and study, the drones that were flying over New Jersey in large numbers were authorized to be flown by the FAA for research and various other reasons. Many of these drones were also hobbyists, recreational and private individuals that enjoy flying drones," she added. "In time, it got worse due to curiosity. This was not the enemy." In December, Trump suggested the Biden administration knew more than it was revealing to the public about the drones, which were spotted throughout the East Coast, though Leavitt did not say whether the drones spotted outside New Jersey were all lawful. "They know where it came from and where it went," Trump said. "And for some reason, they don't want to comment. And I think they'd

"about one day" into his administration while speaking with Republican governors at Mar-a-Lago on Jan. 9 "because I think it's ridiculous that they are not telling you about what's going on with the drones."

takenly reported as drones," the joint statement said.

The drone activity, which was first reported on Nov. 19 by the Morris County Prosecutor's Office, caused temporary flight restrictions in New

Jersey throughout November and December, notably in Bedminster, New Jersey, where the president has a golf club, and over the Picatinny Arsenal military base. But on Dec. 19, a DHS spokesperson said in a statement that the flight restrictions were "out of an abundance of caution."

"We continue to assess there is no public safety threat relating to the reported drone sightings," the spokesperson said. "In coordination with the FAA and our critical infrastructure partners who requested temporary flight restrictions over their facilities, out of an abundance of caution, the FAA has issued temporary flight restrictions over some critical infrastructure facilities in New Jersey."

The Importance of Investing in a Local Water Supply



s we move into 2025, Orange County finds itself grappling with an extended dry spell. With no significant rainfall since spring of 2024, it is a bold reminder of the need to prioritize and invest in a reliable, local water supply. Despite the dry conditions, Orange County residents can rest assured that their water needs are well-supported by the Orange County Water District (OCWD) and its sound management of the Orange County Groundwater Basin.

The basin provides approximately 85% of the water used by 2.5 million people in north and central Orange County. OCWD estimates that even with a very dry winter, the groundwater basin will be approximately 90% full. This is a testament to decades of strategic planning and investment. This vital resource ensures that our region has a dependable water supply, even during prolonged periods without rain. However, maintaining this reliability requires continuous planning, innovation, and funding.

OCWD's flagship project in partnership with the Orange County Sanitation District (OC San), the Groundwater Replenishment System (GWRS), plays

a pivotal role in bolstering our local water supply. As the world's largest water recycling facility of its kind, the GWRS purifies 130 million gallons of wastewater into ultra-pure drinking water every day. This process not only replenishes the groundwater basin but also protects the basin from seawater intrusion from the Pacific Ocean, which can harm the quality of water in the basin. The GWRS serves as a global model for sustainable water management as it creates a new source of water by reusing a once wasted resource, and its benefits are particularly evident during dry times.

In addition to the GWRS, OCWD's commitment to capturing and using stormwater is another critical component of its diverse water supply portfolio. At Prado Dam, operated by the U.S. Army Corps of

Engineers as a flood control facility, frequently sits millions of gallons of Santa Ana River stormwater captured and stored for our use after the winter rains. This pool of water can be strategically held behind the dam and released at rates that the District can capture through its recharge system. Stormwater and local water supply projects are far more reliable and

less expensive than imported water.

To enhance stormwater capture, the District is looking to further advance Forecast Informed Reservoir Operations, or FIRO, at Prado Dam. FIRO leverages improved forecasting tools to better track storms and atmospheric rivers. This allows dam operators to safely increase storage behind the dam and allows us to put more water back into the groundwater basin.

> OCWD is committed to securing Orange County's water future through its leadership in groundwater management and we are always exploring future opportunities to maximize local water supply like groundwater recharge enhancements and sediment removal behind Prado Dam to capture even more stormwater. Through these initiatives, residents and businesses in the OCWD service area, including the cities of Fountain Valley and Huntington Beach, benefit from a reliable local water supply supported by smart water policies and investments in our water infrastructure.

> The dry start to 2025 serves as a reminder of the importance of planning ahead. Thanks to OCWD's proactive measures, our groundwater basin is relatively full, and key projects like the GWRS and stormwater capture provide a critical safety net during these times.

Most Iconic Moments in History



The Grand Staircase Of The Titanic,

Before And After

One of the most impressive features of the RMS Titanic and her sister ship the RMS Olympic was the Grand Staircase, located in the forward part of the ship. This ornate stairwell connected the first-class decks with public rooms. No photographs of the Titanic's Grand Staircase are known to exist, and photos such as this one use the extremely similar Olympic staircase to give us an impression of the Titanic's.

Here's how the Grand Staircases of the Titanic and Olympic were described in a promotional brochure of the time:

A STRIKING INTRODUCTION to the wonders and beauty of these vessels is the Entrance Hall and Grand Staircase in the forward section where one begins to realize for the first time the magnificence of these surpassing steamers. The Grand Staircase, sixteen feet wide, extends over sixty feet and serves seven decks, five of which are also reached by the Three Electric Passenger Elevators. It is modeled closely after the style so prevalent during the reign of William and Mary, except that instead of the usual heavily-carved balustrade, a light wrought-iron grille has been employed, a fashion found in a few of the most exclusive great houses of that period. The Entrance Hall and Grand Staircase are surmounted by a glass dome of great splendor, a fitting crown as it were to these the largest and finest steamers in all the world.

Drinking Alcohol We asked industry veterans about their favorite ready-to-drink N/A options.

Within the bar industry, an increasing number of professionals are reexamining their relationship with alcohol. For Natasha David, former owner of New York City's Nitecap and author of Drink Lightly, that meant "taking a

little break from alcohol," as she shared on Instagram last fall. For others, it might mean cutting back on shift drinks, drinking alcohol only on weekends, or, increasingly, abstaining completely.

Serious Sodas

AVEC mixers are designed to be versatile, meant to pair with spirits or be sipped on their own. Nicolas O'Connor, director of mixology at Apotheke, which has locations in New York City and Los Angeles, enjoys AVEC's bold, not-too-sweet Hibiscus & Pomegranate and Yuzu & Lime flavors.

O'Connor also reaches for bottles of Empire Bottling Works Spruce Beer Soda. "I've been drinking spruce beer all my life," says O'Connor. "It's very much like ginger beer, except with spruce. It's an explosion of pine tree flavor, and it's great for wintertime."

For Chetan Gangan Maverick, the head bartender at Chicago's Indienne, Fentimans Cherry Cola is a go-to soda. Brewed with botanicals including ginger, cinnamon, and nutmeg, Fentimans also contains a hit of real cherry juice. It's best chilled and served with ice.

Bittersweet, quinine-infused tonic water is nearly a cocktail unto itself. Demi Natoli, head bartender at Nashville's White Limozeen, likes to crack open bottles of Fever Tree Elderflower Tonic on booze-free days. "Refreshing over ice and with lime, it's the perfect N/A beverage to substitute for your average tonic water or soda," says Natoli. "The floral notes of elderflower make this an elevated N/A option."

The Lagunitas Hoppy Refresher essentially is soda water dry-hopped with Citra, Equinox, and Centennial hop varieties. Zach Beeson, a bartender at Bar One Fourteen in Indianapolis, often finds the hyper-carbonated beverage more satisfying than beer. "I will not infrequently order one with classic bar food—say, a burger and fries—because I don't feel too full afterwards," says Beeson. social settings when he's trying to extend the evening. Natalie Lichtman, bar lead at San Franciso's Pabu, also extols their virtues. "It tastes just like a regular Negroni without the hangover," she says.

Lichtman also loves sipping and mixing non-alcoholic vermouths, including Roots Divino Bianco, which is steeped with Greek lemons and thyme, and Martini offerings Floreale and Vibrante. The latter, according to Lichtman, reads like a classic Italian red bitter vermouth. Drink it on its own, or make a quick N/A Americano with ver-

jus and soda (the brand also sells ready-made N/A vermouth and tonics).

At Clover Hill in Brooklyn, New York, head bartender Edgar Morales mixes non-alcoholic cocktails with Rasasvada (a.k.a. "zero-proof spirit restoratives" as the brand has dubbed its Rose Bergamot, Black Ginger, and Ruby Artemisia beverages). At home, Morales keeps a bottle of the Ruby Artemisia, which is infused with botanicals including artichoke leaf, black lime, chrysanthemum, cinchona bark, green tea, chamomile, grape skins, and ume plum syrup. Morales allows it to chill in the refrigerator, where it's ready to be poured into a wine glass. By far, bartenders' most

loved non-alcoholic aperitif is Ghia. Gangan Maverick enjoys it as a shot, and Beeson credits the aperitif with getting him through Dry January. "Almost all N/A products have a distinct fake liquor quality about them that makes them difficult to consume on their way since Prohibition-era near beer, a category that once helped select breweries limp along during America's driest days. Alex Jump, a bar consultant and director of operations for Focus on Health, prefers Athletic Brewing's Run Wild IPA straight from the can or mixed into non-alcoholic drinks. Owner of The Fox Bar & Cocktail Club in Nashville, Laura Unterberg likes to pair the same beer with late night cheeseburgers, or mixed it into a cocktail with passion fruit purée, Giffard Sirop Aperitif, and ice.

Both bartenders also dig non-alco-



holic brewer Untitled Art. For Unterberg, it's the brand's Gose, as well as its Chocolate Milk Stout (she recommends trying the latter with added N/A amaro or a scoop of ice cream). According to Jump, Untitled Art's Italian Pilsner "is really off-the-charts good." Also in the craft category, beer consultant Edwin Carino of AmeriCraft-Bier recommends Maine brewer Woodland Farms' line of six non-alcoholic beers, while Lichtman likes Best Day Brewing. But mega beer brands get props from pros too. Vegas bartender Timothy Baer drinks Samuel Adams Just the Haze non-alcoholic IPA, and also recommends Heinken 0.0 with a splash of tomato juice added. For Julian Flores, the beverage director of Palenque Kitchen in Costa Mesa, California, Guinness Draught 0 is the "one N/A beer above all that keeps the real essence of what beer is alive." "The same beautiful head that accumulates on our favorite Guinness also occurs here, giving the beer the leg up in texture," says Flores. "The smooth, velvety palate carries through beautifully and makes you forget that you're not having a regular old stout. As far as taste goes, it's as close to the real deal as I can imagine."

Wines and Not-Quite-Wines

Bartenders sent us numerous non-alcoholic wine recommendations, including South African Lautus Sparkling; Sovi from California; and Giesen's New Zealand Sauvignon Blanc, Premium Red, and Pinot Grigio offerings. But the industry's goto N/A wine is Leitz, produced in Germany's Rheinhessen region and dealcoholized at a low 84°F to preserve as much nuance as possible.

Jump goes for Leitz canned sparkling rosé, and Carino stocks up on its Pinot Noir, Riesling, and Sparkling Riesling. Medina Camacho is also a fan, noting

that the producer has become his new goto shift drink.

"Lots of time after working a long shift, I don't want an alcoholic beverage but am still looking for a good glass of wine," says Medina Camacho. "Leitz Eins Zwei Zero is one of the few non-alcoholic wines that tastes like what I'm looking for."

In addition to nonalcoholic grapebased analogs, there's also an emerging category of genre-bending wine-adjacent beverages. William Edwards, beverage director of Manhatta in New York, enjoys

a glass of Muri Drinks Co. Yamilé after work when he wants something complex and consequence-free. Produced in Copenhagen, the drink combines multiple ferments (carbonic raspberrygooseberry mead, smoked lacto-fermented rhubarb, and goldenrod-pink

These Texas Cities Will Get A Driverless Truck Hub

Torc Robotics will open new facility this year as it works toward launching driverless truck operations by 2027.

Autonomous truck developer Torc Robotics reveals plans for a hub in the Dallas-Fort Worth area, slated to open in 2025.

The company has been validating its SAE Level 4 tech in the past few months and aims to launch commercial operations in Texas starting in 2027.

A number of autonomous truck developers have picked Texas as their home, with the route between Houston and Dallas seeing quite

between Houston and Dallas seeing quite a bit of testing ahead of the launch of operations by multiple carriers.

We've known for a while that Texas has emerged as the epicenter of autonomous truck testing, with a whole cast of startups now experimenting with driverless trucks carrying real cargo.

The rapid rise of the Lone Star State, especially the Houston-Dallas route, as the testing ground for SAE Level 4 driverless trucks has highlighted just how quickly the industry has advanced toward a future where 18-wheelers will operate with no one on board.

Now Torc Robotics, one of the main players in this sphere and a subsidiary of Daimler Truck AG, has taken the first step in establishing a hub for autonomous trucks in the Dallas-Fort Worth metro area, aimed at customer freight pilot programs, autonomous testing, and ultimately commercial operations two years from now. The company currently plans to commercialize its SAE Level 4 tech starting in 2027, after more rounds of testing, and has recently kicked off validation of its autonomous trucks without a driver in the cab on a multi-lane closed road environment.

Texas has welcomed the autonomous vehicle industry, eager to create more jobs in the tech sector.

The tests have been carried out at highway speeds and are intended to preview a scalable product release, testing the systems essentially as jobs in the tech sector while the trucking industry continues to face a driver shortage.

"This new hub will enable us to better serve our current and future customers, enhance our operational capabilities, and drive forward the adoption of autonomous technology in the logistics industry," said CEO Peter Vaughan Schmidt.

The site itself will occupy 18 acres and will include 22,000 square feet of office space, with the company planning to equip it starting early this year.

"This comes on the heels of the successful product acceptance test validation of our autonomous trucks without a driver in a multi-lane, closed-course, highway-speed environment, further showcasing our dedication to the highest safety and product maturity standards," said Andrew Culhane, Chief Commercial Officer at Torc.

they are intended to go into production. This makes this round of tests different from earlier, experimental efforts.

But the path to commercialization is still a long one, even in autonomy-friendly Texas. A commercial rollout will require central control centers for the truck fleets as well, with autonomous trucking companies thereby creating new tech jobs while phasing out some driver jobs.

This is part of the reason why a number of states, including Texas, have welcomed the autonomous vehicle industry, eager to create more Competitors like Volvo Autonomous Solutions and Waabi have also boosted their footprints in the state, including building a special cargo hub for autonomous trucks in the case of the latter.

It remains to be proven whether by the end of the decade driverless trucks will be a common sight on the route between Houston and Dallas. But it's clear that the robotaxi industry is merely one outlet for SAE Level 4 tech in the coming years—and could even be upstaged by trucks running daily routes in the coming years. At least if all goes according to plan..

Developed in 1979 by the Maryland-based J.H. Filbert company, I Can't Believe It's Not Butter! is a spreadable butter-like substitute that had done everything possible to fool diners into believing they were eating butter, when in fact, they were not.

By the early 2000s, I Can't Believe It's Not Butter! was even topping margarine in sales in America and showed no signs of letting up. Unfortunately, J.H. Filbert's one-of-a-kind spread was no longer Americanowned by that time. The company and all of its assets were acquired by Unilever nearly 2-decades earlier, in 1986.

Even if you've never heard the name Amber Hagerman, you've likely received an Amber Alert.

According to KIRO 7, on January 13, 1996, nine-year-old Hagerman was abducted shortly after leaving her grandmother's house to ride her bicycle around an abandoned parking lot in East Arlington, Texas. It took four days for her body to be found in a creek bed miles away, her throat slit, according to True Crime Files. The New York Times reported that heavy rains had caused her body to be swept further downstream from where it had initially been sighted.


Despite a \$10,000 reward that stands to this day and more than 7,000 leads investigated, there have been no credible ones. A member of the original task force, Sgt. Ben Lopez, stated, "All this time, we've only had one witness," a 78-year-old neighbor, Jimmie Kevil, who saw Amber grabbed by a white or Hispanic man in a black pickup truck. Police suspect that there might have been other witnesses who declined to speak to them, fearing deportation. Detective Grant Gildon, a lead investigator on this case, checks yearly to see if there is any technology that could crack the cold case.

The police believe that the killer kept Hagerman alive for at least two days. Had people known that Amber was missing and what





'WHY DO WE WANT TO BASTARDIZE OUR GAME?': MLB PLAYERS AND MANAGERS JOIN CRITICISM OF GOLDEN AT-BAT PROPOSAL

Picture the scene. It's the bottom of the ninth, the Los Angeles Dodgers are down one with two outs and two men on base. Enrique Hernández is due up, but manager Dave Roberts sits him down and sends star man Shohei Ohtani to the plate instead.

That is the essence of MLB commissioner Rob Manfred's Golden At-Bat proposal, which he floated in late Phillies reliever Matt Strahm told The Athletic. "Nah, that messes with baseball history too much. I don't like that one. Say you have a guy like (veteran reliever) Craig Kimbrel, who is going to be chasing 500 saves. Then he's got to do it at the end of his career against Aaron Judge and Juan Soto for every save? Nah. That's not right."

Minnesota Twins shortstop Carlos Correa was concerned about what it



October during an appearance on The Varsity with John Ourand. The rule would allow each team one chance per game to swap in its best hitter for an at-bat, even if it is not his turn.

"There are a variety of (rule change ideas) that are being talked about out there," Manfred said on the podcast. "One of them – there was a little buzz around it at an owners' meeting – was the idea of a Golden At-Bat."

While Manfred was quick to remind listeners that the suggestion was "in the conversation-only stage right now," that hasn't stopped various figures from around the league from criticizing the proposal since then.

"Our game is not built that way," said Joe Maddon – former manager of the Tampa Bay Rays, Chicago Cubs and Los Angeles Angels – in an interview with The Athletic. "Why do we want to bastardize our game and make it like everybody else?

"The more we see things, the less impact they have," he continued. "The Trout-Ohtani thing (the final atbat in the 2023 WBC Championship) was outstanding because you rarely see it. You don't see Halley's Comet every night."

"I can't agree with that one because the relievers are going to be under really, really high stress all the time, and then the injuries are going to go even higher," he said, per The Athletic.

Former Seattle Mariners catcher Chris Howard criticized Manfred for not focusing on what he felt was a more pressing issue – the blackout rules which prevent fans in certain areas watching certain games on TV, to encourage them to attend in person.

"Please tell me the 'Golden At Bat' rule is just an April Fool's joke a few months early," he wrote on X Tuesday. "Someone needs to tell Manfred to stop watching Savannah Bananas games. You want to do something, stop the blackouts."

Meanwhile, seven-time Cy Young Award winner Roger Clemens simply said of the proposal on X: "This can't be real."


Manfred has overseen a controversial period for rule changes as commissioner over the last decade. While the pitch clock, which was introduced in 2023, has generally been met with praise, other ideas like the ghost runner rule – which automatically places a runner on second base at the start of each extra inning in regularseason games - have proved far more divisive. It remains to be seen whether the Golden At-Bat proposal will ever make it beyond the ideas stage. But if it does, it will likely be Manfred's most contentious rule change yet. 



Dear EarthTalk: What are some ways music gear

makers are going green?

Music gear production, from colmaterials, lecting producing gear and packaging with excessive plastic, has numerous negative environmental effects. Collecting wood has led to overharvesting at an unsustainable rate, an increasingly urgent issue for forests and woodlands. Plastic and metal waste have risen, too. These issues have led many music gear makers to implement sustainable changes.



The good news is that some instrument producers have begun harvesting wood from dead or dying trees to prevent the overharvesting of rich woodlands, while others have shifted toward lessused "alternative tonewoods" like basswood and kaya. To decrease metal waste in sourcing for strings, makers are beginning to purchase strings in the form of rods.

shell for guitar picks and vegan leather for straps. String company Stringjoy now has a recycling program, encouraging players to mail back old strings to repurpose the material.

When packaging manufactured goods, music gear makers have begun using paper tape, boxes and envelopes over the traditionally used plastic. Unique innovations have also made packaging greener, such as color-coding each guitar string and its packaging to avoid the environmentally harmful practice of purchasing an entirely new set of guitar strings when only one needs a replacement.

Together these changes have led to a plethora of significant positive outcomes. Increased use of

alternative wood sources has caused a notable decrease in pressure on certain wood species commonly used for instruments like mahogany, rosewood and spruce. Moreover, changes made in packaging and material collection have re-

duced the vast amounts of plastic and metal waste from entering landfills or oceans. Exemplified by the color-coded guitar strings, unique innovations have also made an impact, with the director of product management at music instrument company D'Addario, Brian Vance, commenting that color-coding has eliminated total packaging mass by 70 percent.

More can still be done. Companies advocate for government policies cementing environmentally friendly decisions made by manufacturers, or work toward simpler changes by implementing more recycling programs for their customers. Ultimately, strategic efforts have significantly boosted the sustainability of music gear production, proving that these efforts must be continued and expanded.

ON THE DARK SIDE OR MAYBE THE LIGHTER SIDE **CAROLINE KENNEDY CALLS COUSIN, RFK JR., A 'PREDATOR' BEFORE HHS HEARING**

Caroline Kennedy, the only living child of former U.S. President John F. Kennedy, in a video posted on social media Tuesday called her cousin, Robert F. Kennedy Jr., President Donald Trump's pick for secretary of Health and Human Services, a predator.

"I have known Bobby my whole life," Caroline Kennedy says in the video, in which she's reading aloud a letter she wrote to senators. "We grew up together. It's no surprise that he keeps birds of prey as pets because he himself is a predator."

The White House did not immediately respond to a request for comment.

Caroline Kennedy's son, Jack Schlossberg posted the video on X, formerly Twitter. He said his mother had sent it to a Senate committee, an action first reported by the Washington Post. RFK Jr.'s confirmation hearing is scheduled for Wednesday at 10 a.m.

In the letter, she praised her cousin for recovering from substance abuse but said before getting sober, he encouraged siblings and cousins to use drugs and they wound up addicted, ill or dead. She said, broadly, that her cousin had gone on to "misrepresent, lie and cheat his way through life."

"Bobby is addicted to attention and power," Caroline Kennedy says in the video. "Bobby preys on the desperation of parents of sick children – vaccinating his own kids, while building a following hyp-

ERIN MANSFIELD AND JONATHAN ocritically discouraging other parents from vaccinating theirs."

> She characterized running the Department of Health and Human Services which includes overseeing the Food and Drug Administration and the National Institutes of Health - as "an enormous responsibility, and one that Bobby is unqualified to fill."

> "He lacks any relevant government, financial, management or medical experience," Caroline Kennedy said. "His views on vaccines are dangerous and willfully misinformed. The facts alone should be disqualifying, but he has personal qualities related to this job, which, for me, pose even greater concern."

> RFK Jr. has acknowledged skeletons in his closet and admitted he is "not a church boy." His children's former babysitter, who is about 20 years his junior, accused him publicly of sexual assault. He apologized to her but said he had no memory of the alleged encounter. The case never went to court.

> Seventy-seven Nobel Prize winners penned a letter in December urging the Senate not to confirm his appointment, saying his leadership would "put the public's health in jeopardy."



WASHINGTON (Reuters) -U.S. Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth will announce he is revoking the security clearance and personal security detail for retired Army General and former chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff Mark Milley. Fox News reported on Tuesday cited multiple senior administration officials. 

The Imitation Game (2014)

This historical drama stars Benedict Cumberbatch as Alan Turing, a cryptanalyst who worked for the British government decrypting German intelligence messages during WWII. The film follows his endeavors in trying to crack a Nazi code that is regarded to be uncrackable. The renowned code-breaking war hero, essentially pioneered considered computer science and artificial intelligence. As a homosexual, he was also criminally convicted and faced terrible treatment under U.K.'s homophobic law.

Instead of jail time, he opted for hormone therapy and chemical castration. As the final screen on the film reveals, however, after a year of therapy, he committed suicide at 41-years old.

Lana Turner (1921-1995)

Lana Turner had an acting ability that belied the "Sweater Girl" image MGM thrust upon her, and even many of her directors admitted that they knew she was capable of greatness (check out The Postman Always Rings Twice (1946)). Unfortunately, her private life sometimes overshadowed her professional accomplishments.



Hedy Lamarr (1914-2000)

Hedy Lamarr, the woman many critics and fans alike regard as the most beautiful ever to appear in films, was born

Hedwig Eva Maria Kiesler in Vienna, Austria. She was the daughter of Gertrud (Lichtwitz), from Budapest, and Emil Kiesler, a banker from Lemberg (now known as Lviv). Her parents were both from Jewish families. Hedwig had a calm childhood, but it was cinema that fascinated her. By the time she was a teenager, she decided to drop out of school and seek fame as an actress. and was a student of theater director Max Reinhardt in Berlin. Her first role was a



bit part in the German film Geld auf der Straße (1930) (aka "Money on the Street") in 1930. She was attractive and talented enough to be in three more German productions in 1931, but it would be her fifth film that catapulted her to worldwide fame. In 1932 she appeared in a Czech film called Ekstase (US title: "Ecstasy") and had made the gutsy, move to appear nude. It's the story of a young girl who is married to a gentleman much older than she, but she winds up falling in love with a young soldier. The film's nude scenes created a sensation all over the world. The scenes, very tame by today's standards, caused the film to be banned by the U.S. government at the time.

• Real-estate prices are sky-high, and visitors shell out hundreds for hotels and ski passes.

• From a \$51 million mansion to a ritzy dispensary, I spotted luxury everywhere I looked during my trip.

three-and-a-half-hour drive from my home in Denver Atakes me to one of the most expensive towns I've ever visited

I've lived in New York City and traveled to some of the world's most expensive destinations, such as Paris or Zurich. Meanwhile, a trip to Aspen, Colorado, transformed my definition of luxury.

In Paris and New York, five-star hotels and Michelinstar restaurants coexist alongside \$1 pizza and cheap crepe carts. Aspen — for the most part — lacks the latter. In-stead, luxury hotels and pricey dinners were practically my only options during my five-day visit.

Every day during my trip, I observed moments of opulence. Some I expected — yes, the mountain estates were

shockingly grand, and the town's five-star hotel had glamorous amenities that attract celebrities like Britney Spears and Beyoncé.

There were also surprising moments of extravagance in everyday life. Even purchasing cannabis was a luxe experience.

Sprawling mansions were the first indicator of Aspen's wealthy residents.

From the luxury real estate ads in the Aspen airport to views of mansions from the town's gondola, it was clear from the moment I arrived in the ski town that owning property in Aspen takes a lot of wealth.

In fact, Aspen is the most expensive ski town in the country, with an average weeklong vacation costing \$5,330 for one traveler in 2023.

Blocks away from Aspen's downtown is Red Mountain, a neighborhood known for residents that are so rich it's nicknamed "Billionaire Mountain."

I toured the neighborhood, where famous faces like Walmart heiress Ann Walton and the Bezos family owned property.

Along the drive, I also spotted one of the most expensive homes ever sold in Aspen — a \$72.5-million property bought by Patrick Dovigi, a former professional hockey player and the founder

cret bedroom built for the first owner's mistress. In the most expensive home I toured, I spotted an oxygen system to help combat altitude sickness.

Aspen Park is a 15,000-square-foot home five minutes away from downtown Aspen. The house sold for \$51 million by real-estate agent Carrie Wells.

On a tour of the home, I spotted two elevators, 10 fireplaces, and a Lamborghini-themed garage. I also discovered unusually extravagant amenities throughout the house. For example, an oxygen system that pumps extra oxygen into the room was placed in the primary bedroom. Its goal is to mimic different sea levels and reduce the effects of altitude sickness, as Wells showed me during the tour.

Dalwhinnie's CEO, Brandon Barksdale, told me that the store was intentionally designed to cater to Aspen's elite. Within my first moments inside the store, I was greeted by scents of warm leather and views of crystal glassware sparkled from nearby shelves.

It's not just cannabis Dalwhinnie sells. Next to its display of edibles, flowers, and concentrates are Rolex watches, cashmere scarves, and jewelry with a \$92,000 price tag.

The town's hotels were also some of the country's finest five-star experiences.

At the time, for \$848 a night, I stayed in The Little Nell, Aspen's only five-star and five-diamond hotel. It has welcomed celebrities like Britney Spears and Beyoncé. Later, during my trip, I spent \$700 for a

rent gear, schedule ski school classes, and even preheat their ski boots each morning so they don't have to worry about cold feet.

Both hotels gave guests access to a fleet of luxury vehicles.

I've stayed at hotels that had free airport shuttles on buses and vans, but I never had access to luxury cars at hotels.

At The Little Nell, I had access to a free electric Audi Q8 e-tron car rental.

The St. Regis Hotel also had a daily Champagne-sabering ceremony.

To celebrate the transition from day to night, each evening, a saber was brought out to the courtyard for a dramatic Champagne popping.

While I missed the ceremony on the first night, I happily accepted a glass of Champagne upon check-in. The ceremony felt overly grand for a daily ritual, but I'm also not one to complain about free bubbly.

In town, water fountains and bike-sharing stations were covered for the cold weather.

Small things in Aspen felt like shocking luxuries that I've never seen in cities like New York or Denver, like covering water fountains and bike stations for inclement weather.

In Aspen during the winter, the bicycle rideshares were closed, the bikes were stored away, and plastic covers were placed on the docking stations.

The same went for the town's water fountains. Each water station in Aspen had a snug cover that protected it from the colder temps.

To me, it seemed like the city of Aspen cared about its infrastructure. In the summer, I imagine the town's





In fact, the town's one and only McDonald's closed its doors in 2016.

The most casual restaurants I visited during my stay in Aspen were The White House Tavern, where sandwiches cost between \$21 and \$26 without fries, and a pizza shop that served \$6 slices.

Leather pants and Louis Vuitton purses were normal flight attire at Aspen's airport.

I arrived at the Aspen-Pitkin County Airport in jeans, a turtleneck, and a pullover sweater. This was much nicer than my typical airport attire of leggings and a T-shirt.

Yet I was by far the most underdressed traveler in the airport. In every corner of the small terminal, I noticed people with designer shopbing bags and Louis Vuitton suitcases.

I embarked on tours of five different mansions in Aspen with luxury real-estate a inger, and Carrie Wells. The homes ranged from with luxury real-estate agents Heidi Houston, Doug Leib-

The homes ranged from \$13 million to \$51 million and owning, like wet bars, indoor pools, and 12-car garages. At the top of Billionaire Mountain, I toured a home with an indoor pool and a secret bedroom. At the very top of Billionaire V **6** came with extravagant features I could never imagine owning like wat bars indeer pools and 12 car garages

At the very top of Billionaire Mountain, I stopped at The g Peak House, a 22,000-square-foot estate that sold for \$40 million in 2022.

The Peak House is the highest residence on Red Mountain and real-estate agent Heidi Houston pointed out features that earned the property its price tag.

Beyond its sprawling size and grand views, the home had a wine cave, an enormous living room, and a 12-car **30** garage. Plus, the estate also had its own set of uncommon additions. For example, there was an indoor pool and a se-



night at The St. Regis Aspen Resort. The St. Regis also has five stars and is known for rich and famous visitors like Kim Kardashian, Kanye West, and Paris Hilton.

With famous clientele and expensive rates came luxury offerings that made me feel a bit like a celebrity, too.

The Little Nell had dog food on the room service menu. I expected to see designer dogs playing fetch at the parks and lapdogs in Louis Vuitton purses, but I hadn't considered how hotels and restaurants would cater to pups.

At The Little Nell, for instance, dog owners could order the"Canine Delights Daily," which was served in dogfriendly bowls and included carrots, brown rice, scrambled eggs, and the owner's choice of protein.

Workers at The Little Nell also woke up early to preheat hotel guests' ski boots.

Most five-star hotels have a long list of amenities, but one of The Little Nell's biggest appeals is its ski-in/ski-out access and its own designated ski concierge.

The concierge will help guests coordinate ski lift tickets,

There weren't many name-brand snacks at the airport. My options were limited to \$15 trail mix and marshmallow treats.

The airport had one eatery that sold warm food and snacks. Other than Coca-Cola products, Wrigley gum, and Flipz pretzels, there were few name brands.

I spent about \$8 on a pack of gum and a marshmallow treat. Although I'm used to airport food being overpriced, Aspen's airport set the bar even higher in terms of prices.

At the food counter, travelers could order an \$18 chicken cordon bleu sandwich, a \$19 portobello rice bowl, or a \$19 pork carnitas burrito.

For snacks, options included a \$15 bag of trail mix, caramel-flavored popcorn, and handmade marshmallow treats from The Crispery.

After five days in Aspen, I tasted how the world's richest people live and vacation.

Between a home oxygen system and room-service dog food, by the time I landed home in Denver, I had cataloged new luxuries I never dreamed of.

Previous trips to New York City and Paris had moments of indulgence, but in Aspen, I embraced the town's extravagance the moment I arrived.
