Mel Gibson Leading Republican Candidate for California Governor: Survey

By Martha McHardy / US News Reporter A candidate for California governor. Newsweek has contacted representatives of Gibson for comment via email.

Why It Matters

Gibson has emerged as a leading figure in a recall effort against California Governor Gavin Newsom in recent months after wildfires burned over 47,900 acres in California, destroying more than 16,250 homes and businesses, and killing at least 29 people.

Gubernatorial pollster Guillermo Williams told the California Globe that Gibson's involvement in the recall campaign has put him in a favorable spot in California, meaning if he were to run, his popularity, especially among those frustrated with the current leadership, could galvanize conservative voters. His potential candidacy would also come at a time when Republicans have made historic gains in California. The state shifted toward the GOP by 12 points in 2024 compared to 2020.

What To Know

According to a new straw poll released by The Lost Coast on Tuesday, conducted among 2,640 respondents in California, Braveheart actor Mel Gibson has emerged as the top Republican candidate for California governor, with 12% of the vote.

He beats Riverside County Sheriff Chad Bianco, who is the only current Republican candidate to have entered the race. Bianco received 11% of the vote.

Gibson has been a vocal critic of California's Democratic Governor Gavin Newsom \$14.5-million Malibu mansion burned down in the California wildfires in January.

On an episode of the Joe Rogan podcast the same month, he accused Newsom of failing to "take care of the forest," while jokingly suggesting that the governor was spending all of California's tax dollars on his "hair gel."

He has since joined a recall effort against Newsom, organised by Saving California. At a press conference about the recall petition in February he claimed Newsom doesn't "give a damn" about the state

"There are many who say it is criminal negligence. Do the mayor and the governor give a damn about you? Hell no!" the actor said.

But while Gibson has been one of the most vocal opponents of Newsom, he reportedly has no plans to throw his hat into the ring to replace the outgoing California governor. Gibson's publicist, Alan Nie-

rob, told the California Globe on Thursday that the actor is not running for California governor. "He's sticking with his day job for now," Nierob said.

Gubernatorial pollster Guillermo Williams told the California Globe that Gibson's position in the recall campaign against Newsom has given him "a lot of goodwill" and that Gibson could have given the Republicans their best showing in







Warm River, Idaho **Population: 3**

McDonalds has been a staple of the American way of life since the first restaurant was opened in 1948. By the '70s the fast food restaurant was more than an inexpensive place to eat, it was a way of life. It represented freedom, so when McDonalds made its way to Russia in 1990 people flipped out and stood in line for hours to get a Big Mac on January 31, 1990. At the time the food at the new establishment was steep, with a Big Mac running 3.50 rubles, more than a monthly bus pass. That didn't matter to the people of Moscow, they were ready to thaw out the Cold War with a burger hot off the grill.

YUSHAN

Yushan is Taiwan's tallest mountain, sometimes referred to as Jade Mountain. It's surrounded by a national park of the same name where hikers will find several scenic routes



to explore. The trek to the summit is rather arduous at 15 miles and a 6,110-foot gain, and you'll need to make a reservation to stay at Paiyun Lodge — the only option for sleeping along the route — at least four months in advance. Meet the experts: Danbee Kim, MD, nutrition expert, weight loss surgeon, and assistant professor at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School; Nicola Segata, PhD, study co-author, professor, and principal investigator at the CIBIO Department of the University of Trento; Rudolph Bedford, MD, a gastroenterologist at Providence Saint John's Health Center in Santa Monica, CA

What did the study find?

For the study, researchers analyzed fecal (i.e. poop) data from more than 20,000 people and tracked how much coffee they consumed on a daily basis.

The researchers found that people who regularly drank coffee also had a bacterium called Lawsonibacter asaccharolyticus in their gut.

"People who drink coffee, on average, have a six to eight times higher Getty Images

What he does know is that there's a solid link between coffee consumption and the presence of L. asaccharolyticus. Segata and fellow researchers actually fed coffee to L. asaccharolyticus that was growing in petri dishes and found it made the bacteria grow faster. "It's clear that the coffee was stimulating it," Segata says.

This stimulation is possibly due to metabolites in the coffee. Plus, it's "probably not the caffeine, because decaf had a similar effect," Segata adds.

Can I get L.asaccharolyticus from other foods?

As of now, this bacterium is just linked to coffee.

However, aronia berries contain chlorogenic acid and polyphenols like coffee, so they may have a similar effect, says Danbee Kim, MD, nutrition expert, weight loss surgeon, and assistant professor at Rutgers New Jersey Medical School. "Other foods high in chlorogenic acid such as blueberries, apples, and pears—might also support the growth of this gut bacteria, though more research is needed to confirm this," she says.

How much coffee do I need to drink to reap the gut benefits?

Having a cup or two of coffee a day promotes the growth of L.asaccharolyticus, Segata says. But he points out that "heavy" coffee drinkers, who have three or more coffees a day, have up to 10 times more of the bacteria in their gut compared to people who don't drink coffee.

amount of this bacterium in the gut," says Nicola Segata, PhD, study coauthor, professor, and principal investigator at the CIBIO Department of the University of Trento.

What is L.asaccharolyticus and why is it good for gut health?

We don't actually know a ton about L. asaccharolyticus. The bacterium was first identified in research in 2018. It produces butyrate, a sign of gut fermentation that suggests good digestion and nutrient absorption, Segata explains.

"It's probably producing shortchain fatty acids, which are supposed to be positive modulators of immunity," Segata adds. Still, he says that "strong data" is needed to learn more about what this actually does for your gut health.

Are there any negative impacts of coffee on gut health?

There are a few to keep in mind. The biggest potential drawback is that it could raise your risk of acid reflux, says Rudolph Bedford, MD, a gastroenterologist at Providence Saint John's Health Center in Santa Monica, CA.

"It also increases gastrointestinal mobility and can potentially cause diarrhea," he says. But, overall, Bedford says that coffee is considered a relatively safe drink for people, provided they don't overdo it on the caffeine.

Fremont, CA, is the happiest city in America, and one contributing factor is that the city has the highest share of households with an income above \$75,000, at nearly 80%. Studies have shown that increasing your income up to \$75,000 also increases your happiness, but making more than that does not. Therefore, cities where a lot of people make at least \$75,000 per year are more likely to have maximized their happiness. People in Fremont also have the highest rate of life satisfaction, the fifth-lowest depression rate, and the fourth-highest average life expectancy in the country.

Another contributing factor to Fremont's happiness is the fact that it has the lowest separation and divorce rate in the country, at only 8.9%. It also has the lowest share of adults who report having 14 or more mentally unhealthy days per month, so people in the city seem to be San Jose, CA

The second-happiest city is San Jose, CA, in part because it has the longest average life expectancy in the country, allowing people to enjoy their lives into old age. It also has the fourth-lowest separation and divorce rate, so happy couples can spend their lives together into their golden years, and their kids don't have to deal with the upheaval.

In addition, San Jose has one of the best scores on the health and wellness company Sharecare's Community Well-Being Index, which measures how much residents like where they live, feel safe and have pride in their community. It also scores extremely well on Sharecare's Life-Satisfaction Index, which measures people's health risks based on various physical, financial and social factors Irvine, CA

Irvine, CA, is the third-happiest city, in large part because its residents are healthy. More than 88% of adults in Irvine report having good or better health, the thirdhighest percentage in the country. In addition, nearly 84% participate in physical activities. The city has the seventh-highest life expectancy for residents, too.

Irvine residents don't just have good physical health, though – their mental health is also well taken care of. For example, the city has the third-lowest percentage of adults who report having 14 or more mentally unhealthy days per month, and it has the eighth-lowest depression rate.


Finally, people in Irvine have good incomes, which can also boost their happiness. Nearly 68% of households in the city make over \$75,000 per year, the income level that's been demonstrated to maximize happiness. In addition, marriages in Irvine last better than ones ins many other cities, as Irvine has the third-lowest separation and divorce rate in the nation.



Stylish Amelia Earhart In Chicago 1928

Amelia Earhart, the first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic Ocean, is remembered as a pioneer in the field of aviation. When she disappeared over the Pacific Ocean in 1937, during an attempt to circumnavigate the globe, she was just 39 years old. In addition to being an aviator, Earhart was an educator, a feminist, and -- as you can see from this 1928 photo -a fashion icon.

From the dawn of flight, pilots had always cut a dashing figure in their flight jackets, gloves, goggles, caps, scarves and boots. It was a look waiting for the right woman, and Amelia Earhart wore it well. Earhart used her celebrity and image to try to give American women more options when she launched her own clothing line in 1932, called Amelia Earhart Fashions. As described by the National Air and Space Museum,

Amelia's fashion line was made up of wrinkle-free dresses, skirts, pants, and outerwear. Some designs even used materials such as parachute silk and fabric used for airplane wings. The outfits were crafted for practicality and designed to suit the needs of "active women." They broke the mold for traditional women's dress during the 1930s.



On the Vine or Nearby

Every home bartender has a bottle or two that has been sitting in the back of their liquor cabinet for an extended

period of time. Maybe it's the crème de violette that was purchased to make an Aviation and never touched again, or the 25-year-old single malt that's waiting for the perfect occasion to be opened. After a while, it's natural to wonder if these bottles are even good anymore.

So what is the shelf life of a bottle of alcohol? It turns out the answer is pretty complex.

SHELF LIFE OF LIQUOR FAST FACTS

Unopened liquor of all kinds will generally keep indefinitely if stored properly. Store out of direct sunlight, tightly sealed, in a stable room-temperature environment.

Once opened, distilled spirits like whiskey and gin won't expire or become unsafe to consume, but they may start to taste "off" after 1-3 years.

Liqueurs, opened, will usually last 6 months-1 year.

Vermouths and other wine-based spirits like vino amari should be refrigerated and consumed within 6-8 weeks.

How Long Does Liquor Last?

Distilled spirits and liqueurs are remarkably stable products. Liquor is also pretty much nonperishable, meaning it won't spoil or become dangerous to consume. However, there are a handful of environmental factors that can change the flavor, aroma, and alcohol content of a bottle over time.

Best Practices for Storing Alcohol

When a distilled spirit is exposed to air, it be-

gins to evaporate and oxidize. Oxygen is a

over and wetting the cork for about 60 seconds at a time once a year to prevent it from drying out.

Shelf Life of Dis-

tilled Spirits

If stored properly, an open bottle of liquor will slightly change over time but should generally maintain its character for between 1-3 years. A sealed bottle stored in ideal conditions can last decades while experiencing minimal changes.

Does it matter if you're storing, say, vodka or whiskey? All spirits are extremely similar in their chemical makeup: they're mostly ethanol and water with small variations in compounds, like congeners, that imbue each spirit with flavor. Because of this, two spirits bottled at the same proof in the same environment should theoretically age at the same rate.

There is, however, some anecdotal evidence that there may be differences in the shelf life of certain spirits.

"Based on my observation and experience, I believe that 'white' spirits are less susceptible to change over time that negatively affects flavor," says Moore. "The only bottles I've ever had 'go off' on me were more extensively aged and more expensive spirits that I saved for sipping, often for a good long while."

However, he posits that this could be because drinkers tend to consume bottles of unaged spirits more quickly than heavily aged spirits. It could also be due to the fact that many "brown" barrel-aged spirits, like whiskey, rum, and cognac, spend years resting before being bottled, and therefore have already been subjected to oxidation.

Shelf Life of Liqueurs and Amaro

Much like distilled spirits, liqueurs and most amari are also quite stable. "Sugar is kind of amazing-not only does it taste good, it acts as a preservative in foods and beverages by preventing microbial growth," says Moore. "Liqueurs at a proper sugar level should be shelf stable for more than long enough to enjoy them, say six months to a year."

With heavily sweetened liqueurs, crystallized sugar can sometimes build up around the open-

"If you don't open [a bottle] and store it at room temperature, it will stay good for a very long time," says Stefano Pileggi, a vintage whiskey collector and the proprietor of highend bottle shop Collezione in New York City. But once a bottle is opened, the clock starts



out of the bottle, possibly spilling the spirit and of course allowing air back in."

Unlike with wine or Champagne, it's a bad idea to store a bottle of liquor on its side.

"Any hard alcohol will eat away at the cork," says Pileggi. As the cork degrades, it can allow air to enter the bottle, and the alcohol to evaporate more quickly. If trying to preserve a bottle with a natural cork for enjoyment after many years, Pileggi recommends turning the bottle

ing of the bottle under the cap. To ensure a proper seal and to prevent a stuck cap, use a warm, wet towel to wipe down the bottle after use

Shelf Life of Vermouth and Wine-Based Spirits

Unlike distilled spirits and alcohol-based liqueurs, wine-based products like vermouths and vino amari (like Aperitivo Cappelletti) have a relatively short shelf life.

"We've all likely had a slightly sour Manhattan or a musty Martini, with the culprit being vermouth that's gone bad," says Moore.

Vermouth is fine being stored at room temperature until it's opened. Once opened, bottles should be stored in a refrigerator and used within six to eight weeks.

First Look: The 2026 Morgan Supersport **Boasts Retro Looks, Modern Thrills**

Bored with Porsche 911s? This modern but deliciously retro sports car is cheaper and boasts a better weight-to-power ratio than a base Carrera.

t first glance, the Morgan Supersport looks much like almost every Morgan roadster built since 1953. But under its artfully rendered retro-modernist exterior is a thoroughly modern sports car with a lightweight aluminum chassis, a turbocharged engine, and independent suspension all around. Inside, you find wood and leather if you want it, but also standard air conditioning, a Sennheiser audio system, and a hands-free phone system that uses active noise canceling so you can have conversations while driving with the roof off.

What It is

Morgan designed its new flagship from the wheels up to be a Morgan roadster that can be driven every day, rain or shine. The Supersport-the name was first used on a Morgan in 1927-is also designed to be more obviously different from the four-cylinder Plus Four than its predecessor, the Plus Six. The Plus Six was essentially a Plus Four with a more powerful six-cylinder engine and a wider track and a noticeably edgier demeanor when driven hard. "We wanted to grow the breadth of our portfolio," Morgan CEO Matthew Hole says. "The Supersport is fundamentally about making a more usable Morgan."

The Hardware

The 2026 Morgan Supersport's powertrain, which features a 335-hp, 369-lb-ft version of BMW's B58 3.0liter turbocharged straight-six driving the rear wheels through a ZF eight-speed automatic transmission, is unchanged from the Plus Six, as are the four-wheel disc brakes. The chassis is based on the Plus Six's all-aluminum CX platform introduced in 2019 and still used for the Plus Four, but Morgan engineers made thousands of detail changes to improve ride, handling, and structural rigidity, enough to warrant giving it a new designation, CXV.

If you're looking for a low-mercury alternative to swordfish, try light tuna, shrimp, pollock, catfish, and every health nut's favorite, salmon.

FAMOUS MURDERS THAT REMAIN UNSOLVED



espite what television would have you believe, not every murder is solved in under an hour. No matter how much effort police put into the cases at the time and amateur sleuths do afterward, some murders will never be solved.

That's not to say that all unsolved murders are created equal. For some, almost everything about the case is unknown: the culprit, the victim's identity, the method, the motive. On occasion, the best the police can tell the public is that someone was definitely killed, but anything after that is nebulous. With other cases, everyone knows who did it, but they managed to get acquitted or gave the police an alibi. In still others, the only reason that witnesses aren't pointing fingers at the culprit is that these fingers will be immediately cut off — along with their heads.

However, for what little good it did for the victims, sometimes being unable to solve a murder drives those left behind to improve the world so that no one else has to suffer the same fate.

Dian Fossey: murderers in the mist



Dian Fossey was one of the most prominent voices for gorillas, having written "Gorillas in the Mist" about her experiences with the animals. According to History, inspired by Louis and Mary Leakey, she broke off her engagement and took up a life of wildlife preservation, using her prior work with children to help her gain the gorillas' trust.

According to the BBC, she was found in her cabin in Rwanda, murdered with a machete. The killer knew where to find her bedroom, as they'd cut open exactly that wall. Given how she'd helped soften the reputation of gorillas and contributed to their preservation, it seems difficult to imagine who would have a grudge against her.

That is, People pointed out, it's difficult unless one reads more deeply about her. Fossey had something of a reputation. It has been claimed that she would kidnap and torture poachers while interrogating them, and she allegedly practiced black magic against those who would harm her gorillas, or at least pretended to. One theory posits that she was murdered by the family of a poacher whose sumu, a magical protection bag, Fossey had taken. Even if this did not prove to be accurate, she still made life difficult for antelope poachers and those who'd have liked to drive the gorillas further toward their death so that they could use the land. Fossey was buried among her gorillas, her headstone bearing the Rwandese word for "the lady who lives alone in the forest."

In June of 2020, the brand declared bankruptcy and announced that it would close 900 of its stores, which number 7,300 in total

The closures are slated to take place over the next few years, wrapping up in 2023. When GNC filed for bankruptcy, it asked a judge to protect it against creditors to which it owed money. The judge later would approve a sale to Harbin Pharmaceutical Holding Co., preventing GNC from being sold at auction.

Having said that, the company recently announced that 50 store locations, primarily in the United States, will be closing permanently by the end of 2022. The company plans to offset this with a three-year plan to open to 46 new locations and renovate up to 175 pre-existing locations. Considering the company operates more than 1,600 stores worldwide, this is hardly a drop in the bucket.



THERE'S I THING NO ONE **SEEMS TO BE TALKING ABOUT REGARDING** GENE HACKMAN'S DEATH

When the news broke about the deaths of Gene Hackman and his wife, Betsy Arakawa, my stomach dropped. It's a deeply tragic story in and of itself, but as more and more information was released to the public, there was one thing no one seemed to be talking about: This situation is every family caregiver's nightmare come to life.

Hackman, 95, and reportedly diagnosed with advanced Alzheimer's, was found dead in his Santa Fe home seven days after Arakawa's unexpected passing. The official cause was heart failure, but the reality is much more heartbreaking - he likely died because the person keeping him safe was suddenly no longer there.

Authorities suspect he may not have even understood Arakawa was gone, leaving him alone without essential care, medication, or even basic necessities for at least a week.

This isn't just a devastating celebrity story. The truth is, this could happen to anyone currently caring for a loved one's basic needs. This is especially true for



my family.

When my father was diagnosed with early-onset Alzheimer's, I was in my early 30s, building a career and living thousands of miles away from him. Overnight, I became his caregiver, but I wasn't ready. The first days and months were pretty rough. I had no idea what I was doing. But I also knew that no one was going to be as motivated or committed to taking great care of him as I was.

There are millions of us out there in this position. We're not experts - we're family, friends and neighbors. And we'll move mountains to ensure our loved ones get the best possible care.

At first, I failed spectacularly, missing bills, missing important deadlines, even prescriptions, while unused subscriptions stacked up. Eventually my dad and I found a rhythm. I built systems to start to bring some order back, though any family caregiver will tell you not to bother trying to get everything in order. It's just not going to happen. We found ways to cushion the pitfalls. I got smarter. I set up daily FaceTime check-ins with my dad, hired professional caregivers, created digital records of his medications and medical contacts, and installed smart home devices to monitor his safety. I even started regularly monitoring the weather where he lives to know if there could be an emergency.

But despite all these measures, I still live with one terrifying question: What if I'm suddenly out of the picture?

A few months ago, my fear became dangerously close to reality. I was sitting at a back of an ambulance getting checked out, my first coherent thought wasn't about me — it was of my dad. I've been taking care of my father for 13 years. I'm still the one when

ends up, to ensure he's seen on time and discharged before a shift change. I am the 2 one on the phone pleading to get an appointment with a dermatologist to get that rash hbnews1@aol.com on his cheek looked at tomorrow, not six months from now. Yes, it turned out to be cancer, and the effort was worth it. I have safeguards in place. There are people who help. But if I were to disappear permanently — would they know everything I know? Would they fight for him the way I do? My dad's situation is constantly changing due to his Alzheimer's. Could someone else really step in? For me and too many others, the answer is no. On most days, I like to think of myself as superhuman — strong enough to be a good mom, a good boss and a good daughter. Yet, I know I am one accident, one dia-2025 gnosis, one natural disaster away from our house of cards collapsing. Each day, I face knowing just how fragile the system is and how close we live to a crisis.
This fear is not mine alone. More than 54 million Americans — mostly unpaid and untrained — juggle caregiving responsibilities every day alongside their own personal and professional lives. By 2030, when every baby boomer will be 65 or older, that number will skyrocket. And yet, most caregiving in this country happens in a fragile, makeshift way, held together by love and hope.
For the majority of people, their approach lacks structure, backup plans, or a system of what to do in an emergency. The Hackman-Arakawa tragedy is not an anomaly.
It's at many of our front doors.
During the Los Angeles wildfires, an elderly man and disabled son were left alone after his primary caregiver son was hospitalized the week prior. Without immediate care or anyone to step in the two were not evacuated in time, which ultimately led knowing just how fragile the system is and how close we live to a crisis.

Hope is not a strategy.

Every family should have a contingency plan. Who steps in if the primary caregiver is gone? Who has access to medical records? Who knows the daily routines, the medications, the little details that keep a vulnerable person safe?

Technology can help. Smart home devices can detect movement - or the lack of it. Emergency check-in alerts can notify family if something seems off. Digital tools, like shared apps, can keep medical and financial information in one place, accessible when it's needed most.

For me, setting up a system wasn't just about making my dad's care easier — it was about protecting him and others like me.

I don't say this lightly, but if Gene Hackman had a shared emergency plan or even something as simple as an automated weekly check-in system, he might have been found much sooner. Someone could have stepped in.

We can't afford to ignore this growing crisis within our own families. In just five years, the number of Americans needing long-term care will double. At the same time, professional help is only becoming more expensive and harder to find.

Families will bear more of the burden than ever before. We must stop treating family caregiving as an informal, individual family responsibility, and recognize it as a national priority requiring education, structured support, planning and investment. We urgently need better policies: better workplace accommodations for caregivers, financial support to ease the burden, and expanded access to professional caregiving services.

- care or anyone to step in, the two were not evacuated in time, which ultimately led **22** to both of their deaths.

On a personal level, we need to stop pretending this can be figured out later. Later is too late.

To me, the deaths of Gene Hackman and Betsy Arakawa are a wake-up call. He was a two-time Oscar-winning legend. He had resources. He had family. But that didn't save him.

Caregiving is a responsibility we all share — as families, as communities, and as a country. If we don't act now, personally and systemically, the consequences will be devastating — not just for individuals but for an aging nation on the brink of crisis. And, if you're caring for someone you love, you're already doing an amazing thing. But please ask yourself: What if something happens to me first? If you don't have an answer, it's time to make one.

COOKIES, Cocktails & SPAGHETTI AMATRICIANA BENAZIR BHI

Spaghetti Amatriciana is a classic Italian dish hailing from Amatrice, a small town northeast of Rome. This rustic pasta dish is known for its robust and spicy tomato sauce made with guanciale (cured pork cheek), pecorino cheese, and a good amount of red chili flakes. The sauce clings beautifully to spaghetti, creating a meal that is both simple and deeply flavorful, offering a perfect balance of saltiness from the pork, sharpness from the cheese, and a spicy kick from the chili. Spaghetti Amatriciana is not just a dish but a beloved Italian tradition, often enjoyed with a glass of Italian red wine and good company.

Ingredients:

12 oz spaghetti

4 oz guanciale, sliced into thin strips

1 small onion, finely chopped

2 cloves garlic, minced

1 teaspoon red chili flakes (adjust to taste)

1 can (28 oz) crushed tomatoes Salt and freshly ground black pepper,

to taste 1/2 cup grated Pecorino Romano cheese, plus more for serving

Fresh basil leaves for garnish (optional)

Prepare the Pasta: Bring a large pot of salted water to a boil. Cook the spaghetti according to package instructions until al dente. Reserve 1 cup of pasta cooking water, then drain the pasta and set aside.

Cook the Guanciale: In a large skillet over medium heat, cook the guanciale until it is crispy and the fat has rendered, about 5-7 minutes. Remove the guanciale with a slotted spoon and set aside on a paper towel-lined plate to drain.

Sauté the Aromatics: In the same skillet with the guanciale fat, add the chopped onion and cook until soft and translucent, about 5 minutes. Add the minced garlic and red chili flakes, cooking for another minute until fragrant.

Make the Sauce: Add the crushed tomatoes to the skillet. Season with salt and pepper. Let the sauce simmer for about 10-15 minutes to thicken slightly and develop the flavors.

Combine Pasta and Sauce: Return the crispy guanciale to the sauce. Add the cooked spaghetti directly to the skillet. Toss well to coat the pasta in the sauce.

If the sauce is too thick, add a little reserved pasta water to adjust the consistency.

Finish the Dish: Stir in the grated Pe-Romano corino cheese until melted and combined. Adjust seasoning with more salt, pepper, or chili flakes if needed.

HACKMAN AND BETSY ARAKAWA'S DOG LIKELY DIED OF **DEHYDRATION AND STARVATION, REPORT SAYS**


SANTA FE, N.M. (AP) — An examination of the dog found dead along with actor Gene Hackman and his wife in their Santa Fe home shows dehydration and starvation were likely what led to the animal's demise.



A report obtained by The Associated Press from the Santa Fe County animal control agency details partial mummification and noted that while the severe decomposition could have obscured changes in the organs, there was no evidence of infectious disease, trauma or poisoning that could have resulted in death.

The report noted that the dog's stomach was mostly empty except for small amounts of hair and bile.

The kelpie mix named Zinna was one of the couple's three dogs. It was found dead in a crate in a bathroom closet near Betsy Arakawa's body, while two other dogs survived. Authorities confirmed last week that Hackman died of heart disease with complications from Alzheimer's disease about a week after a rare, rodent-borne disease - hantavirus pulmonary syndrome - took the life of his wife. Hackman, in the advanced stages of Alzheimer's, apparently was unaware that his wife was





dead.

Hackman was found in the home's entryway, and Arakawa was found in a bathroom. Like the dog, their bodies were decomposing with some mummification, a consequence of body type and climate in Santa Fe's especially dry air at an elevation of nearly 7,200 feet (2,200 meters).

Zinnia went from being a returned shelter dog to an incredible companion that was always at Arakawa's side, said Joey Padilla, owner of the Santa Fe Tails pet care facility that was involved in the surviving dogs' care.

Arakawa, born in Hawaii, studied as a concert pianist, attended the University of Southern California and met Hackman in the mid-1980s while working at a California gym.

Hackman, a Hollywood icon, won two Oscars during a storied career in films including "The French Connection," "Hoosiers" and "Superman" from the 1960s until his retirement in the early 2000s.

The pair led a private life after moving to Santa Fe decades ago. A representative for the couple's estate has cited that privacy in seeking to block the public release of autopsy and investigative reports related to their deaths, especially photographs and video. It will be up to a state district judge to consider that request.

Are prairie dogs threatened or endangered these days?

Dear EarthTalk: Are prairie dogs threat-


ened or endangered these days? – Joseph P., via email

Prairie dogs play a key role in grassland ecosystems but encounter many threats. These cute 18" tall tan rodents live in small pockets of habitat across 10 western U.S. states: Colorado, Kan-

Montana, sas, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oklahoma, South Dakota, Texas and Wyoming. However, they are now extinct in Arizona. Roughly half of the U.S. population is in South Dakota, Montana and Wyoming. As keystone species those whose presence is critical for the balance and health of their ecosystemsthey support more than 130 other species such as burrowing owls and black-footed ferrets.

Habitat loss is one of the most noteworthy threats. Urban development, agriculture and land conversion have dramatically reduced habitats. This leaves fragmented areas that make it hard for populations to thrive. Climate change further

compounds thing by altering grassland ecosystems: Rising temperatures and prolonged droughts reduce food and water availability, further impacting prairie dogs and the species that depend on them. "Everything that was in the southern part of their range is kind of lopped off, and you're really seeing almost Colorado become the central core part of their range and then shifting north," says Sterling Krank, Prairie Dog Co-

alition Director at The Humane Society of the United States.

Another challenge is sylvatic plague, a disease transmitted by fleas that has wiped out large colonies. Also, prairie dogs are viewed as pests by farmers and ranchers. This leads to poisoning and other eradication efforts. "Prairie dogs, once one of the most abundant animals on the prairie, now occupy two percent of their historic range," reports Christine Peterson in High Country News.

Prairie dogs aren't federally recognized as endangered. But activists are working to conserve



them, launching a wide range of initiatives including habitat restoration, vaccination efforts against the plague, and public awareness programs. These initiatives have brought achievements. But difficulties remain.

Anybody can help safeguard prairie dogs and their habitat. Supporting groups such as Defenders of Wildlife and the Prairie Dog Coalition aids in financing habitat restoration and disease prevention initiatives. Promoting sustainable methods that protect grasslands and reduce human-wildlife conflicts is another way to help. Raising awareness about the ecological importance of prairie dogs and taking part in citizen science initiatives to track their populations are additional methods to help in their conservation.

Prairie dogs may not hold endangered status at the moment, but their decreasing populations and the dangers they encounter highlight the necessity for intervention. Assisting conservation efforts and adopting sustainable methods is one approach to help guarantee the survival of these species and uphold the balance of North America's grassland ecosystems.





ON THE DARK SIDE OR MAYBE THE LIGHTER SIDE.... KATIE PORTER ENTERS CALIFOR-NIA GOVERNOR'S RACE AS HARRIS' POSSIBLE ENTRY LOOMS

The California governor's race isn't waiting for former Vice President Kamala Harris to make up her mind whether she's going to run. Former Democratic Rep. Katie Porter, who represented Orange County in the US House for three terms, announced Tuesday she's entering the race to succeed Gov.

Gavin Newsom, who is term-limited from running again.

Porter enters a field that already includes Lt. Gov. Eleni Kounalakis, former Los Angeles Mayor Antonio Villaraigosa, former state Senate Leader Toni Atkins and former state Controller Betty Yee. Last year, Porter finished a distant third in the state's top primary for an open US Senate seat that was ultimately won by Adam Schiff.

Porter, a former law student and protégé of Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren, often went viral for using calculations on a white board in congressional committee hearings—and she has a white board as part of the background of her video announcement.

The thrust of Porter's announcement video is focused on national politics, featuring shots of President Donald Trump, Elon Musk, Vice President JD Vance, House Speaker Mike Johnson and former Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell. Both her script and the imagery behind it reference a more open approach to immigration while fighting corruption, climate change and high costs.

"What California needs now is a little bit of hope and a whole lot of grit," Porter says. "As governor, I won't ever back down when Trump's hurting Californians."

Porter makes a specific reference to pushing for increased firefighter pay while in Congress. In a mark of a race that will likely be decided by which Democrat gets the most support, she also says she's committed to "abortion rights, LGB?Q rights and immigrant rights," while saying she's against "Big Oil, Big Banks or Big Pharma screwing people over." None of that may matter, though, if

None of that may matter, though, if Harris decides to run – which people close to her have said would need to happen by the summer, so she could have time to make a full-fledged case for why she might want the job and not be seen as just going for a consolation prize after her presidential loss last year. Advisers and friends remain divided over whether they want her to try for the job in Sacramento next year or attempt another presidential run in 2028.

Porter said in December that Harris entering would likely have a "fieldclearing effect," and she is sticking by

that even as she launches her run, which is why the former vice president and California senator isn't included in the numbers that her campaign is trying to tout. And though says she has a poll that has her in the best shape of "likely" Democratic candidates – her campaign's count of likely candidates notably doesn't include Harris.

"She wouldn't run against Kamala," a Porter adviser told CNN, "and likely none of the others will either."

SCIENTISTS THINK THIS IS WHY WOMEN LIVE LONGER THAN MEN

• A new study may explain why women live longer and why their brains are less prone to cognitive decline.

• The study explored the untapped potential of women's extra X chromosome.

• Researchers are hopeful that interventions can be made to take maximum advantage of the x chromosome's power for both sexes.

Females, on average, live nearly five years longer than males. They also tend to experience age-related cognitive decline at slower rates. Scientists have many theories as to why this may be. Now, a new study takes a deeper look, aiming to explain why women tend to live longer and age smarter.

The study, conducted on mice, was recently published in Science Advances. As you might know, people born as females carry two X chromosomes, and people born as males carry an X and Y. The study helped researchers develop a theory that females' extra X chromosome—which is located in the corner of the cell

20-month-old female mice, an age likened to 65-year-old humans. In one group, the researchers engineered the extra X chromosome to remain silent, and yet, found it to express over 20 genes. Many of those expressions lit up in the hippocampus, a region of the brain that deals with learning and memory that typically takes a hit throughout the aging process.

"Aging had awakened the sleeping X," Dubal said.

And so, this research may help explain why women, and their brains, tend to lead longer lives. With this discovery, the hope is that researchers may be able to find interventions that may amplify the helpful, "sleeping" expressions in both men and women, now that they are known to exist.

"Cognition is one of our biggest biomedical problems, but things are changeable in the aging brain, and the X chromosome clearly can teach us what's possible," Dubal said. Obviously, much more research needs to be done, but the findings are certainly promising.



and thought to be inactive—is activated later in life. Researchers at the University of California San Francisco found that it expressed over 20 genes in aged female mice, most of which aid brain development.

"In typical aging, women have a brain that looks younger, with fewer cognitive deficits compared to men," said Dena Dubal, M.D., Ph.D., a professor of neurology and the David A. Coulter Endowed Chair in Aging and Neurodegenerative Disease at UCSF in a statement regarding the study. "These results show that the silent X in females actually reawakens late in life, probably helping to slow cognitive decline."



GOV. MEL GIBSON?

2006 gubernatorial election in California saw actor and Republican candidate Arnold Schwarzenegger elected with 55% of the vote

"For Gibson right now, he seems to be in a good spot. He has the special ambassador title right now, and he is very much a leading voice on the Newsom recall. That is getting him a lot of goodwill. He's also speaking up for victims of the wildfires that way too. So not running for Governor makes sense since this is working for him right now. He's winning a lot of people back by doing this too," Williams said.

"Republicans are in the best spot they have been in for years at gaining back ground. The GOP did very well in California in the 2024 elections, and they want to build further next year. At the very least, they want to the race to have the best showing for the party since 2006. Gibson could have gotten there, but he also does have significant baggage with him. We'll see who else runs," he added.

But while Williams thinks Gibson could have been a strong candidate for California governor, he said that many Californians have grown weary of celebrity politicians, like Ronald Reagan and Arnold Schwarzenegger.

"It would have been really something for him to run, especially in this race," Williams said. "But a lot of Californians have tired of celebrities running for office in recent years. Reagan was a union head, Schwarzenegger had a few Presidential appointments, and Gibson was named a special ambassador. So it's not like they don't have anything. But a lot of Californians also want anyone besides Porter or Harris."

Former Democratic Representative Katie Porter, who left the House for an unsuccessful Senate run last year, announced she is running for California governor this week. "What California needs now is a little bit of hope and a whole lot of grit, fresh blood and new ideas, leaders with the backbone to fight for what's right," Porter said in her announcement video. "That's why I am running for governor."

Porter enters a field that is stacked with contenders, including former Democratic mayor of Los Angeles Antonio Villaraigosa, former speaker of the California State Assembly Toni Atkins, the state's current lieutenant governor Eleni Kounalakis, as well as Califor-

California since 2006 if he had chosen to run. The nia State Superintendent of Public Instruction Tony Thurmond and former state controller Betty Yee.

But none have emerged as a clear front-runner yet. However, that could change if former Vice President Kamala Harris enters the race. Harris is reportedly considering a run, and has given herself a deadline to decide.

"If Vice President Harris were to choose to run, I am certain that would have a near field-clearing effect on the Democratic side," Porter told The Orange County Register late last year.

"I would support her if she ran, I've always supported her in everything she's done. She would be field-clearing," Democratic California Attorney General Rob Bonta told Politico after saying he would not run for governor.

But The Lost Coast poll shows that Harris is not necessarily the front runner in the race, with Porter beating her with 25% of the vote to the former vice president's 20%. But Williams told The Globe the poll should be taken with "a pinch of salt."

"The Lost Coast poll was just a straw poll with, like you said, mainly North Coast voters. There was no demographic data and was literally just a single question. If this was a SoCal poll, then we would likely see some of those LA candidates get some higher percentages. Take it with a pinch of salt," he said.

Other polls have shown Harris leading other Democrats by a wide margin if she were to enter the race.

According to Emerson College Polling/Inside California Politics/The Hill, conducted between February 10-11 among 1,000 California registered voters, nearly 6 in 10 Democratic primary voters in California, 57% would vote for Harris as governor.

Porter received 9% support, while former California State Assembly Speaker Antonio Villaraigosa and current Lieutenant Governor Eleni Kounalakis each garnered 4%. Seventeen percent of voters remained undecided.

Without Harris in the race, Porter's support rose to 21%, followed by Villaraigosa at 9% and Kounalakis at 5%. A significant 45% of Democratic primary voters were undecided. The poll had a margin of error of +/-3 points.

Another poll from UC Berkeley and the Los Angeles Times, conducted in October, showed Harris with a substantial advantage over other candidates for the 2026 California gubernatorial race.

What People Are Saying

Gubernatorial pollster Guillermo Williams told the California Globe: "The Lost Coast poll was just a straw poll with, like you said, mainly North Coast voters. There was no demographic data and was literally just a single question. If this was a SoCal poll, then we would likely see some of those LA candidates get some higher percentages. Take it with a pinch of salt. That being said, the poll did show that it was still in line with where Californians stood with candidates from previous polls, so there is value here. Plus, the North Coast can be a microcosm of California in some ways, so it at least shows who is popular in the race.

"Porter and Harris were not surprises, although Porter coming before Harris was. Gibson had yet to be on a poll, and it showed him doing quite well. A lot of these candidates are only known in their circles around LA or San Diego or Sacramento, and look how well they did. Gibson, LA guy, is a known entity and he has the lead. Bianco too was a surprise, although he is the only big-name Republican in the race right now.


"Overall, while being skewed to the North Coast, the poll does show that Harris and Porter are the Democratic favorites, with the GOP is still working on it. Bianco has support, but so does Gibson. Right now, we live in a world where we could see a Kamala Harris-Mel Gibson race for Governor next year. But neither of them have said one way or another yet too. Wow."

What Happens Next

California will elect its next governor in 2026 when Newsom's term ends. Newsom is believed to be a contender for the 2028 Democratic nomination for president. However, he has not yet expressed any desire to run.

In November, Newsom had +550 odds of becoming the next president, according to SportsBettingDime, which amounts to a 15 percent chance. Harris had +2500 odds, or a 4 percent chance.

SIX OF THE WORLD'S 10 MOST POLLUTED CITIES **ARE IN ONE COUNTRY, REPORT SHOWS**

HONG KONG — Six out the world's 10 most polluted cities are in India, while California has the worst air pollution in North America, a new report shows.

New Delhi was the most polluted capital city globally, followed by N'Djamena, capital of Chad, a country in central Africa with the world's worst air pollution, according to the 2024 World Air Quality Report published Tuesday by IQAir, a Swiss air monitoring company.

Ten out of the 15 most polluted cities in North America, including Ontario and Bloomington, are located in California as the United States reclaimed the top spot as the most polluted country in the region in 2024, the report said.

India, the world's most populous country with more than 1.4 billion people, saw a 7% decline in PM2.5 concentration in 2024, but air pollution remains a "significant health burden" that reduces life expectancy in the South Asian nation by an estimated 5.2 years, the report said. The country's major pollution sources include industrial discharge, construction dust and the burning of crop residues. PM2.5 refers to tiny particles with a diameter of 2.5 micrometers or less that can go deep into lungs and even enter the bloodstream. Deriving from emission sources such as the combustion of gasoline and oil, it is linked to premature death, heart attacks and breathing difficulties. Though the World Health Organization (WHO) recommends that average annual concentrations of PM2.5 should not exceed 5 micrograms per cubic meter, only 17% of global cities meet its air quality standard, the report said. Chad's PM2.5 levels were more than 18 times higher than the WHO guideline, with mineral dust in the Sahara Desert as the primary source of air pollutants. Oceania, which includes Australia, New Zealand and Pacific island nations, is the world's cleanest region, with 57% of cities meeting the WHO standard. Bangladesh and Pakistan, both of which neighbor India, ranked as the second and third most polluted countries. Last November, air quality in Pakistan reached "hazardous" levels due to a combination of festival celebrations, brick kiln emis-Costfoto / NurPhoto via Getty Images sions and adverse weather. China, the world's biggest emitter

of greenhouse gases, recorded lower air pollution levels in more than 300 cities in 2024, the report said.

While noting Chinese authorities' "ambitious" goal to reduce the country's annual average PM2.5 concentration levels to below 25 micrograms per cubic meter, the report said that is still "significantly" above the WHO guideline of 5 micrograms.

A senior Chinese environmental official said last month that China aimed to effectively eliminate severe air pollution by the end of this year. China announced its "war against pollution" in 2014.

The report also noted the "considerable" gaps in air quality that still exist in many parts of the world. Currently, only 21% of the world population has access to hyper-local, real-time air quality information, according to IQAir estimates.

Cambodia had no official government monitoring, while

many critical regions in Africa and West Asia lack sufficient monitoring. In comparison, North America has a "robust" air , quality monitoring infrastructure that accounts for 56% of ≥ ground-based stations."Air pollution remains a critical threat to both human health and environmental stability, yet vast populations remain unaware of their exposure levels," Frank 5 Hammes, global chief executive of IQAir, said in a statement. "Air quality data saves lives," Hammes said. "It creates K

much needed awareness, informs policy decisions, guiding public health interventions, and empowers communities to b take action to reduce air pollution and protect future generations."

Last week, U.S. embassies and consulates said they had @ stopped monitoring air quality abroad, ending a program that had provided essential public health data for more than a decade.

Data the U.S. provided in dozens of countries had led to noticeable improvements in local air quality in China and elsewhere, reducing premature deaths and generating cost savings associated with lower mortality, studies found.

Air pollution accounted for 8.1 million deaths globally in **3** 2021, according to the WHO. Children under the age of 5 are considered especially vulnerable, with health effects including 31 premature birth, low birthweight, asthma and lung disease.


